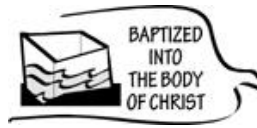

From the Pastor's desk...

DEAR PARISHIONERS,

In preparation for mid-May Evaluation from the Team of friars and our lay partners in ministry, I want to alert you once again to the existence of our Parish Council, or the better term, our Pastoral Council of Ministries. Those who sit on this Council are involved in Pastoral Ministry, assisting the Pastor in his shepherding of the faithful who participate in the life of this faith community. This body of 20-persons stand as an advisory board to the Pastor and are selected from among registered parishioners.

What is the function of the Council in the life and direction of St. Bon's? What does the Pastoral Council do? What are the requirements for serving on the Council? Who is on the Council? Below you will find answers to these questions.

First and foremost, the Pastoral Council of Ministries is guided by the parish's Mission Statement which appears every week on our bulletin. Members of the Pastoral Council accept the challenge to minister to the larger community by way of careful strategic planning, both short term and long range.

Members have a unique opportunity to contribute to critical services, like education and social justice, or to help develop the liturgical feasts and seasons for the benefit of all parishioners. As stated in the Constitution of the Council, the purposes and objectives of the Council are:

1. To implement and restate, when necessary, the mission of St Bonaventure Parish.
2. To set goals annually in fulfillment of the mission and to formulate policies and plans to meet them.
3. To provide guidelines and support for Pastoral Council Subcommittees and Ad Hoc Committees of the Pastoral Council of Ministries.
4. To monitor the execution of Parish plans and programs and to evaluate their effectiveness.

5. To encourage, facilitate, support, and provide liaison with all parish organizations and activities, mindful of the Parish Mission Statement.

What does the Council do?

Each Council member provides a valuable connection between parishioners and the Pastor. The Parish Mission Statement comes to life through their efforts. On the third Wednesday evening of every month, the Pastoral Council meets in the Tailor Shoppe located under the sacristy. All members of the parish are welcome as observers.

The Pastor and members of the Parish staff discuss issues and hear reports from members about current issues and projects within the Parish. Members also serve as liaisons to the working committees of the Pastoral Council. Current Pastoral Council ministries/committees explained in our Ministry booklet include:

- Adult Faith Formation
- Faith Formation of the Young
- Altar Servers
- Family Life
- Finance and Stewardship
- Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist Ushers
- Lectors
- Liturgy and Worship
- Music Ministry
- Ministry of Prayer/Prayer Group
- Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults [R.C.I.A.]
- Ministry to the Sick
- Social Concerns

What are the Requirements for Serving on the Pastoral Council?

The principal requirements for candidates are a heart for service and a willingness to give of one's time.

Any Roman Catholic who is at least eighteen (18) years of age, a registered member of the Parish for at least one year, and has already received the Sacrament of Confirmation is eligible for selection to the Council. Pastoral Council members serve for three-year terms.

Who is on the Council?

The current Pastoral Council includes those who recently joined the parish as well as longtime parishioners. They all attend Mass every Sunday. Their professional back-grounds range from

business to education to federal service. Their roots represent a wide geographical footprint, but they all have in common a commitment to St. Bonaventure's mission.

On the first Sundays of the month, look for Council Members at church and at "Coffee & ..." (they will be wearing name tags) and ask them about the work of the Council.
