## **FEEDING THE POOR AND HUNGRY**

Once again, our St. Bonaventure's community generously supported the food collection for the Father English Center, on Saturday, April 20.

Contributions included:

30 frozen dinners	200 lbs. of rice
30 bags of groceries	2 frozen turkeys
18 cartons of canned goods	6 frozen hams
29 bags of used clothing	\$300 in donations
35 lbs. frozen chicken breasts	

These totals include a \$150 contribution to the Community Food Bank of New Jersey for the account of the Father English Food Pantry made by our Francis J. O'Byrne Knights of Columbus Council #240, as well as \$150 in donations to the same account made by two generous parishioners.

As we anticipate this month's collection, please reflect on the words of Pope Francis; "In imitation of our Master, we Christians are called to confront the poverty of our brothers and sisters, to touch it, to make it our own and to take practical steps to alleviate it." Your support of the Father English Food Pantry with your frozen dinners and groceries is a "practical step".

## **THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER**

### **First Reading: Acts 5:27-32, 40b-41**

The high priest chastised Peter and the other apostles for continuing to preach when they had been ordered to stop. Peter replied he would rather obey God than men, considering God's power even over death. They are again warned to stop speaking of Jesus, and then freed.

### **Second Reading: Revelation 5:11-14**

John had a vision of many angels and all the living creatures of the world gathered around a throne. The angels cried out that the slain Lamb was worthy of receiving power, glory and praise. Then every creature on earth called out praise to God and the Lamb, and the elders fell down and worshipped.

### **Gospel: John 21:1-19**

Jesus appeared to the disciples for the third time since his resurrection while they were fishing. They hadn't caught anything, and then Jesus advised them to cast their net from the other side of the boat. When they did this, they caught a great number of fish. Jesus then asked Peter three times, "Do you love me?" When Peter said he did, Jesus asked him to tend and feed his sheep.
