## ANNUAL FINANCE REPORT

On the weekend of October 5 and 6, a long-time parishioner and Chair of our Finance Ministry, John Szczomak, CPA, gave the annual Financial Report at all the Masses. The summary sheet that he distributed shows that the rental of our school, now Public School #29, constitutes 45% of our annual operating budget. That, together with the weekly collection, fundraisers, stipends and donations, and the supplement from the Franciscan Friars of Holy Name Province (HNP) makes our life and ministry at St. Bon's possible. John also alerted us to the increase in stipends for Masses and Sacraments. These requested donations have not been increased for at least the last two decades. Even with this increase, the amounts are still on the low side as compared to other local churches. Thank you for your continuing support of our parish!
