Parish Feast Day: Next Sunday

The Feast of St. Charles Borromeo is celebrated by the Roman Catholic Church on November 4, 2019. As is the custom of our Parish of St. Charles Borromeo, Resurrection and All Saints, we will hold our Church celebrations next Sunday, November 4th. Masses at St. Charles Borromeo will begin with the **Vigil Mass at 5:30pm**. On **Sunday** itself there will be **ONLY TWO MASSES at St. Charles**: 8am and 10:30am. Following the 10:30am Mass there will be a Family Celebration with activities for everyone, adults and children, in the Auditorium. At Resurrection on November 4th there will only be **ONE MASS at 11:00am**. A celebration in the school cafeteria will follow the 11am Mass at Resurrection.

Reaching St. Charles and Resurrection on November 4th

Next Sunday Daylight Savings Time begins, and all clocks will go back one hour on Sunday morning at 2AM. If you don't adjust your clocks on Saturday evening the chances are you will arrive one hour early for Mass at St. Charles and at Resurrection.

Besides the time change next week there is also the running of the New York Marathon (Mr. Ghislain Mehou and Dr. Justin Kopa of our Parish will be competing). The running of the New York Marathon will make it very difficult to reach 141st and 151st Street from the East Side of Manhattan, south of 138th Street. Do not try to use the Madison Avenue Bridge. Instead try to reach St. Charles and Resurrection from points North of 138th Street and from the Westside of Manhattan.

St. Charles Borromeo 1538-1584

St. Charles Borromeo was one of the most significant religious figures of the 16th Century. He lived at a time of great social upheaval in the Catholic Church brought about by the Protestant Reformation. That Reformation brought about changes in Catholic practices because of the criticism of the Protestant reformers. Those changes affected worship, the training of clergy and the behavior of bishops. The Council of Trent was called in 1545 to develop a Catholic response to the Protestant Reformation.

St. Charles Borromeo as a Cardinal and as Archbishop of Milan was important in demonstrating ways to implement the changes brought about in the Catholic Church after the Council of Trent. With Religious Orders like the Jesuits he fostered Catholic education which had been sorely lacking. Charles Borromeo died following his efforts to provide support and help to people of Milan affected by the plague of 1578.

Archdiocese of New York: Consecrating Our Lives to the Blessed Mother, November 5th to December 9th

The past 18 months has been particularly challenging for the people of our Archdiocese, given the revelations about child abuse by clergy/religious and civil suits against our churches. Such a painful set of experiences begs for a period of consolation and renewal of our collective Spirit. The Cardinal proposes that we engage in a period of prayer and reflection which would ultimately lead us to a consecration of ourselves to the Blessed Virgin Marian on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception (celebrated this year on Monday, December 9th).

The period of prayer and reflection would begin on November 5th and extend for 33 days until December 8th and culminate in a Mass of Consecration on December 9th. There is a guidebook which is available during the 33 Day period of preparation to Consecration. The guidebook is placed in the vestibule of the Church. Each person would do the preparation individually, at their own time, but we would come together finally for the Consecration together.

## **Fiesta parroquial: Próximo Domingo**

La Fiesta de San Carlos Borromeo es celebrada por la Iglesia Católica Romana el 4 de noviembre del 2019. Como es costumbre de nuestra Parroquia de San Carlos Borromeo, Resurrección y Todos los Santos, celebraremos nuestras celebraciones de la Iglesia el próximo domingo el 4 de noviembre. Las misas en San Carlos Borromeo comenzarán con la Misa de Vigilia a las 5:30 pm. El domingo mismo habrá SOLO DOS MISAS en San Carlos Borromeo: 8:00 am y 10:30 am. Después de la misa de las 10:30 am habrá una celebración familiar con actividades para todos, adultos y niños, en el auditorio. En Resurrección, el 4 de noviembre, solo habrá UNA MISA a las 11:00 a.m. Una celebración en la cafetería de la escuela seguirá después de la misa de las 11 am en Resurrección.

## **Llegando a San Carlos y Resurrección el 4 de noviembre**

El próximo domingo comienza el horario de invierno y todos los relojes retrocederán una hora el domingo por la mañana a las 2 a.m. Si no ajusta sus relojes el sábado por la noche, es probable que llegue una hora antes para la misa en San Carlos Borromeo y en Resurrección.

Además del cambio de horario la próxima semana, también se correrá el maratón de Nueva York (el Sr. Ghislain Mehou y el Dr. Justin Kopa de nuestra parroquia competirán). La carrera del maratón de Nueva York hará que sea muy difícil llegar a la calle 141 y 151 desde el lado este de Manhattan, al sur de la calle 138. No intente usar el puente de la Avenida Madison. En su lugar, trate de llegar a San Carlos Borromeo y Resurrección desde los puntos al norte de la calle 138 y desde el lado oeste de Manhattan.

## **San Carlos Borromeo 1538-1584**

San Carlos Borromeo fue una de las figuras religiosas más significativas del siglo XVI. Vivió en una época de gran agitación social en la Iglesia Católica provocada por la Reforma Protestante. Esa Reforma provocó cambios en las prácticas católicas debido a las críticas de los reformadores protestantes. Esos cambios afectaron la adoración, el entrenamiento del clero y el comportamiento de los obispos. El Concilio de Trento fue llamado en 1545 para desarrollar una respuesta católica a la Reforma protestante.

San Carlos Borromeo como cardenal y como arzobispo de Milán fue importante para demostrar formas de implementar los cambios producidos en la Iglesia católica después del Concilio de Trento. Con órdenes religiosas como los jesuitas, fomentó la educación católica que había sido muy deficiente. Charles Borromeo murió tras sus esfuerzos por brindar apoyo y ayuda a las personas de Milán afectadas por la plaga del 1578.

## **Arquidiócesis de Nueva York: Consagrando Nuestras Vidas a la Santísima Madre, del 5 de noviembre al 9 de diciembre**

Los últimos 18 meses han sido particularmente desafiantes para la gente de nuestra Arquidiócesis, dadas las revelaciones sobre el abuso infantil por parte de clérigos / religiosos y demandas civiles contra nuestras iglesias. Un conjunto de experiencias tan dolorosas ruega por un período de consuelo y renovación de nuestro Espíritu colectivo. El Cardenal propone que participemos en un período de oración y reflexión que finalmente nos lleve a una consagración de nosotros mismos a la Bienaventurada Virgen Mariana en la Fiesta de la Inmaculada Concepción (celebrada este año el lunes 9 de diciembre).

El período de oración y reflexión comenzará el 5 de noviembre y se extenderá por 33 días hasta el 8 de diciembre y culminará en una Misa de Consagración el 9 de diciembre. Hay una guía disponible durante los 33 días de preparación para la Consagración. La guía se coloca en el vestíbulo de la Iglesia. Cada persona haría la preparación individualmente, en su propio momento, pero finalmente nos uniríamos para la Consagración juntos.

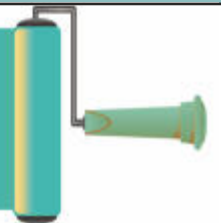
