Fifth Sunday of Lent

“O my People, I will open your graves and have you rise from them!” God speaks through the prophet Ezekiel to His people who are breathing and working and eating and fighting but are dead nevertheless. They have lost sight of the God who gives them light. God searches for a remnant who will give Him the praise and honor deserving of Him. That remnant will rise from their graves and be loosed from the bonds of death.

Our Lenten Season is almost at an end. If anything the current Coronavirus crisis inclines us to be mindful of God and to remember what we owe Him. Let us keep in mind the fasting, the prayer and the good works which we promised to our God at Ash Wednesday. We are God’s people, the remnant that gives Him what he is rightly due. Be with the leaders of all nations. Give them the foresight to act with charity and true concern for the well-being of the people they are meant to serve. Give them the wisdom to invest in long-term solutions that will help prepare for or prevent future outbreaks. May they know your peace, as they work together to achieve it on earth.

Whether we are home or abroad, surrounded by many people suffering from this illness or only a few, Jesus Christ, stay with us as we endure and mourn, persist and prepare. In place of our anxiety, give us your peace.

Jesus Christ, heal us.

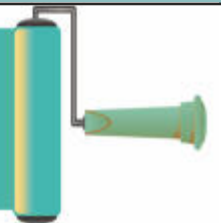
