El dolor y la incomodidad de estos meses me afectan profundamente. Aunque creo firmemente que Dios está presente y resolverá por el bien de nuestro mundo esta continua cascada de dolor, desearía que nuestras vidas pudieran ser diferentes ahora mismo.

Sin embargo, incluso cuando expresó ese deseo, recuerdo las convincentes palabras de nuestro antepasado Frederick Douglas: ***“Quienes profesan favorecer la libertad y, sin embargo, desaprueban la agitación son hombres que quieren cosechas sin arar el suelo. Ellos quieren lluvia sin truenos y relámpagos. Quieren el océano sin el rugido de sus poderosas aguas”***. Dios crea el cambio necesario para el bien de todos a través de la lucha.

COVID-19 revela la susceptibilidad de muchos, si no la mayoría, de nuestra gente debido a nuestras condiciones de salud: diabetes, enfermedades respiratorias, enfermedades cardíacas y obesidad. Sin acceso a una atención médica accesible y adecuado, nuestra gente no puede sobrevivir a pandemias ni a una gran cantidad de crisis médicas. Este ciclo continuo de opresión debe terminar en algún momento. Debe terminar de alguna manera. Pero no terminará fácilmente. La lucha es con nosotros mismos a medida que cambiamos los hábitos de comer y beber para que podamos vivir. La lucha también es con un clima político y económico que tiene poco interés por hacer que la atención médica sea alcanzable y accesible para todos los estadounidenses.

El movimiento de protesta actual revela la creciente conciencia de que el racismo no es solo algo que las personas de color reconocen. El advenimiento de las grabaciones de video ha revelado el desagradable desprecio por las vidas negras que existe en nuestro país. Cualquier persona con ojos para ver y oídos para oír puede reconocer el odio que algunos con poder ejercen sobre otros con menos poder. Sin embargo, el poder es conocido por su renuencia a renunciar a sus prerrogativas. El privilegio blanco es real y significa que la gente negará su propia oscuridad. Ignorarán nuestro dolor. Relativizarán el significado histórico. Creerán firmemente que el problema está resuelto y es hora de seguir adelante. Si queremos el bien de todos, nunca debemos dejar de luchar contra el racismo.

Quédense conmigo en esta lucha, Iglesia. Como su pastor, no me rendiré ante este virus y ni en contra de este racismo. No te rindas tampoco.

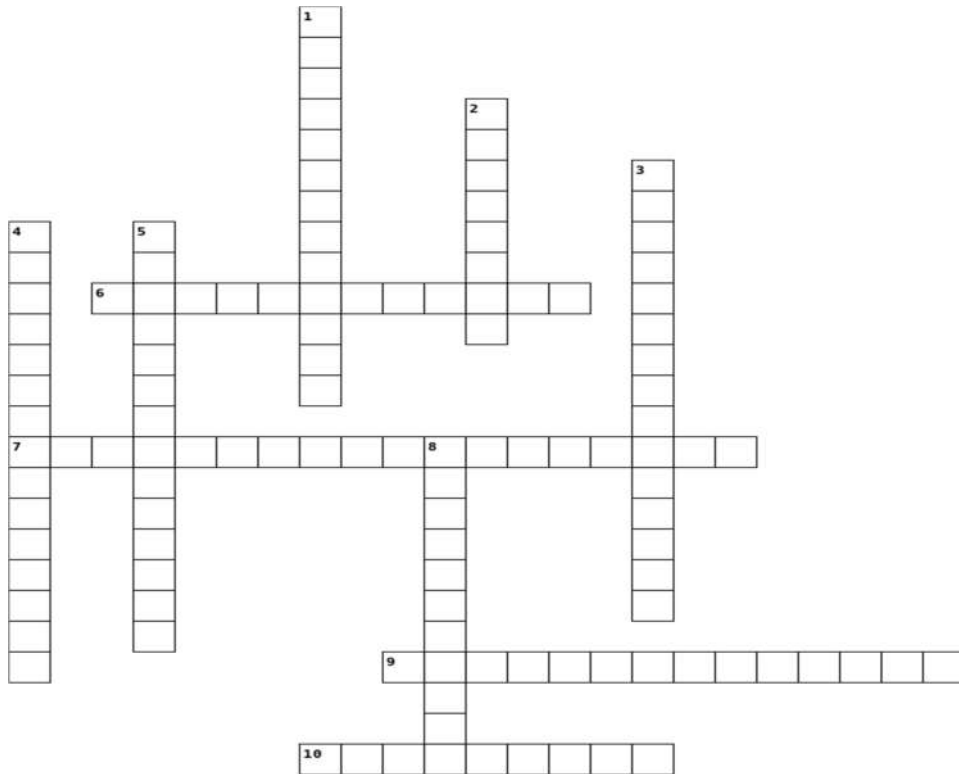
