## Fr. Gregory Chisholm, SJ ~ Pastor's Message

### **Welcome to August 2020**

One year ago, the changes in our common life that we are enduring now as we approach August never would have occurred to me. Usually the Summer in the Parish is slower and much less active than the rest of the year. This year, by contrast, I find parishioners more engaged with mutual care, health, safety, even the education of children and survival, than with Vacations. I have had several conversations about protests/actions, zoom meetings, conferences, planning, books and about cable tv but almost nothing about Caribbean cruises and nothing about Summer camps and nothing about the beaches. No one seems to be just relaxing. Our lives, as incredible as it seems, have been changed.

Almost as a consequence of Coronavirus, the terrible events in Minneapolis and the coming Presidential election, I am living a new and different life. I am busier and more engaged than normal for August. Our Sunday worship, especially, takes on a newer and more poignant urgency for those of us who take our Christian lives seriously. Indeed I wonder whether we will ever be able to return to the communal life we once had (the way we used to gather, the kind of celebrations we used to have, the former character of our social gatherings and ministries) or whether we must simply accept that we are living in a brand new time. Must we get it into our heads that with Masks, the Internet and social distancing, this is a brand-new day?

"See I am doing a something new!!! Now it springs forth, do you not perceive it," God says in the 43rd chapter of the Book of Isaiah. There will be new ways in the wilderness and even rivers in the wasteland, the Lord promises. But the former ways are not promised to us.

### **Bienvenido a agosto de 2020**

Hace un año, los cambios en nuestra vida común que estamos soportando ahora a medida que nos acercamos a agosto nunca se me habrían ocurrido. Por lo general, el verano en la parroquia es más lento y mucho menos activo que el resto del año. Este año, por el contrario, encuentro a los feligreses más comprometidos con el cuidado mutuo, la salud, la seguridad, incluso la educación de los niños y la supervivencia, que con las vacaciones. He tenido varias conversaciones sobre protestas/acciones, reuniones en zoom, conferencias, libros de planificación, y sobre televisión por cable, pero casi nada sobre cruceros por el Caribe y nada sobre campamentos de verano y nada sobre las playas. Nadie parece estar simplemente relajándose. Nuestras vidas, por increíbles que parezcan, han cambiado.

Casi como consecuencia del Coronavirus, los terribles eventos en Minneapolis y las próximas elecciones presidenciales, estoy viviendo una vida nueva y diferente. Estoy más ocupado y más comprometido de lo normal en agosto. Nuestro culto dominical, especialmente, adquiere una urgencia más nueva y conmovedora para aquellos de nosotros que tomamos nuestras vidas cristianas en serio. De hecho, me pregunto si alguna vez podremos volver a la vida comunitaria que alguna vez tuvimos (la forma en que solíamos reunirnos, el tipo de celebraciones que solíamos tener, el carácter anterior de nuestras reuniones sociales y ministerios) o si simplemente debemos aceptar que estamos viviendo en un tiempo completamente nuevo. ¿Debemos tener en cuenta que con Máscaras, Internet y el distanciamiento social, este es un nuevo día?

"¡Mira, estoy haciendo algo nuevo! Ahora surge, ¿no lo percibes?", Dice Dios en el capítulo 43 del Libro de Isaías. Habrá nuevas formas en el desierto e incluso ríos en la tierra baldía, promete el Señor. Pero las formas anteriores no nos son prometidas.

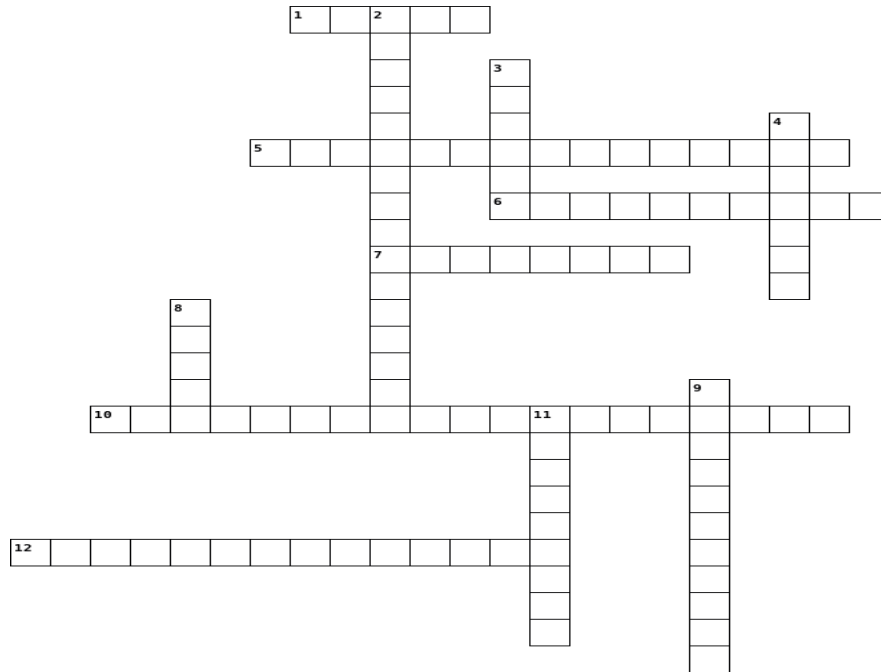
