Message from the Pastor

Fraternity

Pope Francis has just published an Encyclical on “Fraternity and Social Friendship”, released on the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, October 4th. The document is long and probably can’t be read in one sitting, but it is certainly worthwhile.

An Encyclical is a letter sent out by the Holy Father to all his fellow Bishops, Patriarchs and Church Leaders. The topics cover issues related to the reception of Catholic faith. The most recent Encyclical on Fraternity is titled “Fratelli Tutti”, which means “all brothers,” a title taken from the writings of St. Francis of Assisi. In this letter the Pope lays out a hope, a desire, an appeal for the world to recover a sense of Fraternity. This is different from solidarity. This is different from equality. This is different from connectedness. Fraternity is more like the experience someone finding a man beaten up on a road. Instead of ignoring the man in distress because of fear or because of a lack of time or because the man is not one of his own people, the person going by stops to help the man out of a sense of fraternity (Luke 15).

Pope Francis fills his Encyclical with real life and real-world examples of the successes and the failures of contemporary humanity to achieve Fraternity. I encourage you to read and pray about this letter over the next several weeks. My belief is that you will see you own life and the life of our country reflected in the pages of the Pope’s insightful teaching.

Fraternidad

El Papa Francisco acaba de publicar una encíclica sobre "Fraternidad y Amistad Social", publicada en la fiesta de San Francisco de Asís, el 4 de octubre. El documento es largo y probablemente no se puede leer en una sola sesión, pero sin duda vale la pena.

Una encíclica es una carta enviada por el Santo Padre a todos sus hermanos obispos, patriarcas y líderes de la Iglesia. Los temas abarcan temas relacionados con la recepción de la fe católica. La encíclica más reciente sobre la fraternidad se titula "Fratelli Tutti", que significa "todos los hermanos", un título tomado de los escritos de San Francisco de Asís. En esta carta el Papa establece una esperanza, un deseo, un llamamiento para que el mundo recupere un sentido de fraternidad. Esto es diferente de la solidaridad. Esto es diferente de la igualdad. Esto es diferente de la conexión. La fraternidad se parece más a la experiencia de que alguien encuentra a un hombre golpeado en un camino. En lugar de ignorar al hombre en apuros por miedo o por falta de tiempo o porque el hombre no es uno de su propio pueblo, la persona que pasa por aquí se detiene para ayudar al hombre a salir de un sentido de fraternidad (Lucas 15).

El Papa Francisco llena su encíclica de la vida real y ejemplos del mundo real de los éxitos y los fracasos de la humanidad contemporánea para alcanzar la Fraternidad. Os animo a leer y orar acerca de esta carta en las próximas semanas. Creo que verán su propia vida y la vida de nuestro país reflejada en las páginas de la enseñanza perspicaz del Papa.

VOTERS REGISTRATION IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Registration Rules & Deadlines

New York

To register to vote, you must: Be a US citizen,
Be a resident of NY state for a minimum of 30 days before election day, Be 18 years old
Not be a prisoner or on parole for a felony
Not currently voting in another location
Not currently judged to be incompetent by a court

Please note: Governor Cuomo signed a bill that says New York residents can request an absentee ballot based on concerns for their health

New York

In person, you must register to vote 25 days (10/09/2020) before election day

By Mail: The registration application must be postmarked 25 days before election day and received 20 days (10/14/2020) before election day

Online Registration: Application must be entered 25 days (10/09/2020) before election day

New Jersey

To register to vote, you must: Be a US citizen
You must be a resident of New Jersey and at your address for at least 30 days before the next election
You must be 18 years old
Is not serving time on parole for a conviction in NJ or another state in the US
Must not be judged to be mentally incompetent by a court

New Jersey

In person you must register to vote 21 days (10/13/2020) before election day

By mail: The registration application must be postmarked 21 days (10/13/2020) before election day

Online: N/A

Connecticut

To register to vote, you must: Be a US citizen
Be a resident of Connecticut and reside in the town where you are voting
You must be 18 years old
You must have served your time and parole for a felony

Connecticut

In-person: apply 7 days (10/27/2020) before election day

By mail: The registration application must be postmarked 7 days (10/27/2020) before the election.

Online Registration: application must be entered 7 days (10/27/2020) before 11/03/2020



VOTERS REGISTRATION IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Absentee Ballot / Mail- In Ballot Rules & Deadlines

New York

You may vote by mail if : you are absent from your country or if you are a NYC resident, you are absent from New York on election day

You are ill, have a physical disability or because you are a primary caregiver of someone who is physically disabled

You are in jail awaiting action

You reside in VA facility as a patient or resident

You are in jail awaiting Grand Jury action or in prison, other than for a felony

New York

In person the absentee ballot must be received by 5PM -7 days before election day

By Mail: The absentee ballot must be received by 5PM 7 days (10/27/2020) before election day

Online: N/A

New Jersey

You may apply to vote by mail if you have registered to vote in NJ

In person -the absentee ballot must be received by 3:00PM the day before election day

By mail: 7 days (10/27/2020) before election day

Online: N/A

Connecticut

You may vote by mail if you have an illness and cannot vote in person

You will be absent from your town during the voting hours

You are physically disabled and cannot vote in person

You are on active duty in the US military

Your religion forbids to be on duty as an election official during all voting hours and the site is not your voting location.

Must be received 1 day before election day

Para registrarse para votar, debe: Ser ciudadano estadounidense,
Ser residente del estado de Nueva York durante un mínimo de 30 días antes del día de las elecciones. Tener 18 años de edad.

No ser prisionero ni estar en libertad condicional por un delito grave.

Actualmente no vota en otra ubicación.

Actualmente no se lo considera incompetente por un tribunal.

Tenga en cuenta: el gobernador Cuomo firmó un proyecto de ley que dice que los residentes de Nueva York pueden solicitar una boleta de voto ausente basada en preocupaciones por su salud

Debes tener 18 años

No debe ser considerado incompetente mental por un tribunal
