Now Hiring: Emergency Snow Laborers for Winter Season

Snow Laborers Crucial in Clearing Snow and Ice After Big Winter Storms;

New for this Season: Advance Online Registration Required

The New York City Department of Sanitation has announced that registration is now open for those interested in working as Emergency Snow Laborers for the upcoming winter season. Emergency Snow Laborers are per-diem workers who shovel snow and clear ice from bus stops, crosswalks, fire hydrants and step streets around the five boroughs after heavy snowfalls. Snow Laborers earn \$15 per hour to start, and \$22.50 per hour after 40 hours are worked in a week. To better allow for social distancing and COVID-related protocols, those interested in becoming a Snow Laborer must register for a 15-minute application at nyc.gov/snow. To comply with COVID-related safety protocols, potential Snow Laborers should wear a mask or face covering while at the registration appointment. Applicants should not attend the appointment if they have any COVID-19 symptoms, if they recently traveled to a state with high rates of COVID-19 transmission, or if they recently had close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19.

Senior Recognition 2020 in our Parish

I am extremely pleased that the Parish of St. Charles Borromeo, Resurrection and All Saints will recognize the achievements of two outstanding members of the Congregation for our Senior Recognition Awards this year. We are honored to celebrate Ms. Pearl Emmanuel of St. Charles Borromeo Church and Mr. Timothy Taylor of Resurrection Chapel. Pearl Emmanuel will receive her award at Mass on Sunday, November 8th, at 10 am in St. Charles Borromeo Church. Timothy Taylor will receive his award at Mass on Sunday, November 8th, at 11:15 am in Resurrection Church. Below are brief biographies of our awardees.

Ms. Pearl Emmanuel

Pearl Emmanuel was born and raised in Fayetteville, NC. She will be 80 years old on November 24th. Pearl is the eldest of nine children born to Claudia and Douglas Emmanuel. Her five surviving brothers and sisters continue to live in North Carolina. Their family is close and Pearl visits them regularly in North Carolina or on family excursions. Pearl originally came to New York City as a youngster at the request of her aunt, Pearl Wilson. Her aunt was raising four nephews and nieces and asked Pearl's parents if Pearl might help. Pearl attended Junior High School while living with her aunt in New York. In New York Pearl attended night school three nights per week for post-secondary school training. She studied bookkeeping. Eventually she found employment as a bookkeeper at several different companies in New York's Garment District over many years. For four years she also worked for St. Charles Borromeo School.

Pearl Emmanuel was born into a Baptist family. She was introduced to the Catholic Church out of a desire to do the best for her children. So Pearl was baptized in 1967 at St. Charles Borromeo Church by Fr. Edward Dugan. Her two daughters, Miranda Gillis-White and Bobette Pineda, both graduated from St. Charles Borromeo school, as did several of Pearl's grandchildren.

Pearl enjoys a lively family and church life. Besides her two daughters, she has six grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren. She thoroughly enjoys helping people. She learned very early on from her aunt, Pearl Wilson, the satisfaction of helping other people whether in the family or in the neighborhood. At St. Charles Borromeo Church Pearl is a member of the St. Vincent de Paul Society and the Catholic Women of Harlem. She collaborates with several other similarly generous parishioners of the St. Vincent de Paul Society in providing food weekly to neighborhood persons and parishioners in need. Through the Catholic Women of Harlem, she is able to provide a variety of supports for parents and children in need. Her motto in life is, "Let the work I've done speak for me."

Mr. Timothy Taylor

Timothy Taylor received his BFA in and MFA from Carnegie Mellon University. Over the years he has taught at Touro College, Metropolitan College, College of New Rochelle, and LaGuardia Community College where he also worked as an administrator. Mr. Taylor presently serves as the Associate Dean of Students at Touro College. As Associate Dean of Students, Mr. Taylor is responsible for admissions testing, coordinating student activities, adjudicating student code of conduct violations, serves as chief academic integrity officer and investigates student grievances. Some of Dean Taylor's professional activities include participation in the Mellon Mays Undergraduate Fellowship Program Coordinator's Conference in Cape Town, South Africa. He participated as a group discussion leader at the Oxford Round Table at University of Oxford in England.

Tim Taylor has been a longtime member of the Parish of St. Charles Borromeo Resurrection and All Saints. He has served as the President of the Amen Choir at Resurrection Chapel for eight years, having been elected twice. He has also served as a Trustee for the Parish. For many years, he was a member of the Parish Council and for two years was a co-chair of the Parish Council. He has been a representative of the Parish to the Harlem Catholic Deanery for over ten years and is a former chair of the Harlem Catholic Deanery Council. Most importantly, Mr. Taylor is the proud husband of Dr. Vivian Taylor, the proud father of daughters Avanti and Dara, son-in-law Maurice Brown, and the proud grandfather of Maurice, Taylor, and Elly.
