Now Hiring: Emergency Snow Laborers for Winter Season

Snow Laborers Crucial in Clearing Snow and Ice After Big Winter Storms;

New for this Season: Advance Online Registration Required

The New York City Department of Sanitation has announced that registration is now open for those interested in working as Emergency Snow Laborers for the upcoming winter season. Emergency Snow Laborers are per-diem workers who shovel snow and clear ice from bus stops, crosswalks, fire hydrants and step streets around the five boroughs after heavy snowfalls. Snow Laborers earn \$15 per hour to start, and \$22.50 per hour after 40 hours are worked in a week. To better allow for social distancing and COVID-related protocols, those interested in becoming a Snow Laborer must register for a 15-minute application at nyc.gov/snow. To comply with COVID-related safety protocols, potential Snow Laborers should wear a mask or face covering while at the registration appointment. Applicants should not attend the appointment if they have any COVID-19 symptoms, if they recently traveled to a state with high rates of COVID-19 transmission, or if they recently had close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID -19.

Message from the Pastor

Worship at Our Parish for Sunday, November 15, 2020

My hope is that our Parish will be able to continue Masses at St. Charles Borromeo and Resurrection. We have struggled to provide a safe environment in our Churches where men and women of all ages can worship safely. In this we have been successful.

Nevertheless, the incidence of coronavirus infections in New York City have been steadily increasing along with hospitalizations and, sadly, even deaths. The Mayor of New York may close the Public Schools in the City to in-person classroom instruction on Monday, November 16, 2020. If he does so that will be a signal to the Churches that we may also need to consider placing tighter controls on the numbers of people welcome at Mass.

For this weekend all are welcome. However, if you are elderly, the continuing effect of the Coronavirus in our country suggests that it is better for the elderly to stay at home. If you are sick and have a fever, you are also encouraged to stay home. If you have an underlying health condition, like respiratory disease or heart disease or a compromised immune system or type 1 or type 2 diabetes, you are encouraged to stay at home. Evidence suggests that this is for your own safety.

Our Parish continues to offer in-person worship at both of our Churches: St. Charles Borromeo and Resurrection Chapel. In order to attend Mass, however, you must wear a mask covering your mouth and your nose. You must also maintain a distance of six (6) feet between yourself and other person within our Churches. Seats are designated where visitors are permitted to sit.

There are Sunday Masses at St. Charles Borromeo in English at 7:45am and 10am. There is also livestreaming of the 10am Mass over the Internet, which can be viewed from the Parish website <https://scbrchurch.org/>. There are also Sunday Masses at Resurrection Chapel in Spanish at 9:30am and in English at 11:15am. The Masses are 60 minutes to 75 minutes long.

On Sunday afternoon there is also a Prayer Service on ZOOM at 1pm which you can link to or you can reach by telephone. This Sunday, November 15, 2020, the leader of prayer is Ms. Tanya Douglas who is co-chairperson of the Social Justice Ministry of our Parish. The link information for the Sunday Prayer Service is:

Message from the Pastor

Adoración en nuestra parroquia para el domingo 15 de noviembre de 2020

Mi esperanza es que nuestra Parroquia pueda continuar las Misas en San Carlos Borromeo y Resurrección. Hemos luchado para proporcionar un ambiente seguro en nuestras iglesias donde hombres y mujeres de todas las edades puedan adorar de manera segura. En esto hemos tenido éxito.

Sin embargo, la incidencia de infecciones por el coronavirus en la ciudad de Nueva York ha aumentado constantemente junto con las hospitalizaciones y, lamentablemente, incluso las muertes. El alcalde de Nueva York puede cerrar las escuelas públicas de la ciudad para la instrucción presencial en el aula el lunes 16 de noviembre de 2020. Si lo hace, será una señal para las iglesias de que es posible que también debamos considerar la posibilidad de establecer controles más estrictos sobre el número de personas da la bienvenida a la Misa.

Para este fin de semana todos son bienvenidos. Sin embargo, si eres una persona mayor de edad, el efecto continuo del Coronavirus en nuestro país sugiere que es mejor que las personas mayores de edad se queden en casa. Si está enfermo y tiene fiebre, también se le recomienda que se quede en casa. Si tiene una condición de salud subyacente, como una enfermedad respiratoria o una enfermedad cardíaca o un sistema inmunológico comprometido o diabetes tipo 1 o tipo 2, le recomendamos que se quede en casa. La evidencia sugiere que esto es por su propia seguridad.

Nuestra parroquia continúa ofreciendo adoración en persona en nuestras dos iglesias: San Carlos Borromeo y la Capilla de la Resurrección. Sin embargo, para asistir a Misa, debe usar una máscara que cubra su boca y su nariz. También debe mantener una distancia de seis (6) pies entre usted y otra persona dentro de nuestras Iglesias. Los asientos están designados donde los visitantes pueden sentarse.

Hay misas dominicales en San Carlos Borromeo en inglés a las 7:45 am y las 10 am. También hay transmisión en vivo de la misa de las 10 am a través de Internet, que se puede ver en el sitio web de la parroquia <https://sbrchurch.org/>. También hay misas dominicales en la Capilla de la Resurrección español a las 9:30 am y en inglés a las 11:15 am. Las misas duran entre 60 y 75 minutos.
