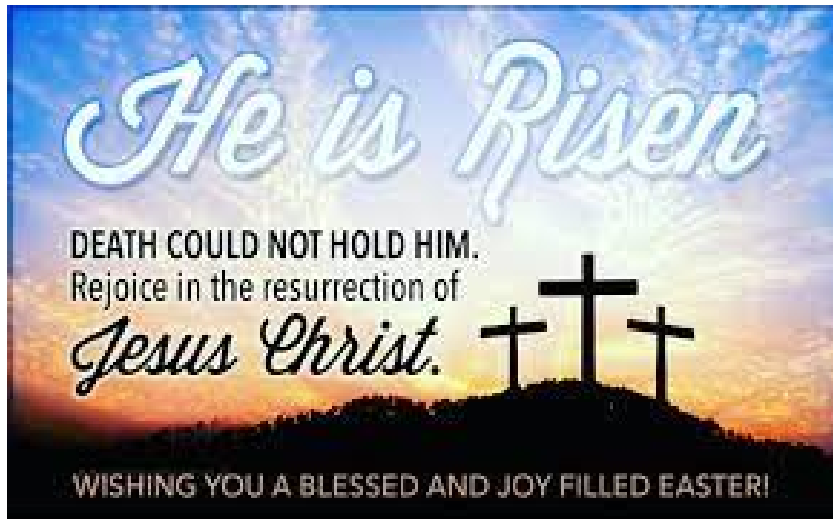

I was honored to have had a glimpse of the Resurrection two weeks ago when Mr. Jerome Pannell of St. Joseph of the Holy Family Parish walked into the Sacristy of St. Charles Borromeo following the first night of our Lenten Revival. Jerome is well known in Harlem and in our Catholic Community. He is a loving son of Theresa Maddicks and a devoted father to his son. He works as a respected Counselor and a Basketball Coach at LaSalle Academy in Manhattan. Last April 2020, Jerome was afflicted by a fearsome exposure to the Coronavirus as medical professionals were still learning how to respond. He was hospitalized and placed on oxygen. For part of his time in ICU he was unable to communicate with the outside world. I remember being contacted by his Mother and I remember requests for prayers on his behalf being sent out from many quarters in the Harlem community. His return to health took many, many months. Yet he did return to health, praise God. When he walked into the Sacristy two weeks ago he enveloped me in an enormous bear hug that went on and on. The site of him and that enormous hug gave me hope that Easter soon would dawn for all of us.

**Vaccinations**

In New York we have reached the point where every over the age of 29 years is now eligible to receive one of several Vaccines to prevent COVID-19 illness. I strongly recommend that all those in our congregation who are 30 and over get vaccinated immediately. My concern is for the health of our parishioners during the continuing incidence of the coronavirus in the New York metropolitan area. In addition, your vaccination positively affects the health of others who are not yet vaccinated or not yet able to be vaccinated. I am supported in my recommendation by several health professionals in our congregation who have spoken forcefully about this to our people,
