The Derek Chauvin Verdict: A Reflection by Wallace Ford

“Today Derek Chauvin was convicted on all three counts for killing George Floyd. This former Minneapolis police officer faces more than a half century of time in prison. In many parts of the country and the world this has been seen as a cause for celebration.

“In some very real ways this verdict is a reason for celebration because it is so rare that in America a white policeman is convicted for killing a Black man. It is so rare that when it happens it is a cause for celebration. White police officers in America have been killing Black men with impunity for centuries – so when there is a unicorn of an outlier of a result where justice actually appears, it is a cause for celebration.

“It should be pointed out that in the days and hours leading up to the verdict that there was real concern that there would be an acquittal or a mistrial. There was a real concern that even though Derek Chauvin’s murder of George Floyd was viewed around the world, because in America the tradition was that white police officers could kill Black men with impunity.

“In many ways it is a damn shame that a slam dunk, open and shut, videotaped murder might not be reason enough to convict a white police officer for killing a Black man. The concept of Black Lives Matter has barely entered the national consciousness and even a casual student of history knows that there are far too many unreported tragedies at the hands of police that were never recorded and will never be known except by the dead victims and their bereaved families.”

El veredicto de Derek Chauvin: una reflexión de Wallace Ford

“Hoy Derek Chauvin fue condenado por los tres cargos por matar a George Floyd. Este ex oficial de policía de Minneapolis enfrenta más de medio siglo de prisión. En muchas partes del país y del mundo esto se ha considerado un motivo de celebración.

“De alguna manera muy real, este veredicto es motivo de celebración porque es muy raro que en Estados Unidos se condene a un policía blanco por matar a un hombre negro. Es tan raro que cuando sucede es motivo de celebración. Los oficiales de la policía blancos en Estados Unidos han estado matando a hombres negros con impunidad durante siglos, por lo que cuando hay un unicornio de un resultado atípico en el que la justicia realmente aparece, es un motivo de celebración.

“Cabe señalar que en los días y horas previas al veredicto hubo una preocupación real de que hubiera una absolución o un juicio nulo. Existía la preocupación real de que a pesar de que el asesinato de George Floyd por Derek Chauvin fuera visto en todo el mundo, porque en Estados Unidos la tradición era que los oficiales de policía blancos podían matar a hombres negros con impunidad.

“En muchos sentidos, es una lástima que un asesinato en video, abierto y cerrado, no sea razón suficiente para condenar a un oficial de policía blanco por matar a un hombre negro. El concepto de Black Lives Matter apenas ha entrado en la conciencia nacional e incluso un estudiante casual de historia sabe que hay demasiadas tragedias no reportadas a manos de la policía que nunca fueron registradas y nunca serán conocidas excepto por las víctimas muertas y sus familias en duelo.”

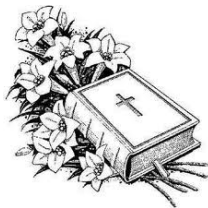
