### **TRIUMPH: Transforming your Mental Health through Prayer and Healing**



If you or someone you know is struggling with **stress, anxiety, or loss**, we invite you to contact us about the [TRIUMPH research study](#) at Columbia University Irving Medical Center.

We are working with **Black Churches** in New York City to identify community members who are at risk of experiencing depression. **Community Health Workers** from each church will conduct a screening survey that lasts about 15 minutes to assess your eligibility for the study. Adults ages **18 and older** who live in the 5 boroughs of NYC are eligible to participate.

This study is being led by Drs. Sidney Hankerson and Olajide Williams from the Columbia University Irving Medical Center. All study activities are being conducted **virtually through Zoom or telephone**.

Participants that are enrolled in the study are eligible to receive a Target Gift Card.

### **~ The Solemnity of The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary ~**

MARY, CAUSE OF OUR JOY. Mary declares in Luke 1:47, “My spirit finds joy in God my savior.” The well-known prayer, “Litany of the Blessed Virgin,” addresses Mary as the “cause of our joy.” This title of Mary is most appropriate for today’s feast of her Assumption into heaven. Mary’s entire being found joy in the Lord (LK 1:46). She spread that joy to others, even Elizabeth’s unborn baby, John, who leapt “for joy” at the sound of Mary’s voice as she carried Jesus in her womb, into their home (LK 1:44). Mary was also present in the upper room at Pentecost (Acts 1:14ff) and surely exulted with joy as her spouse, the Holy Spirit, filled the apostles, who then brought three thousand people into the Church.

Finally, Mary “was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory” (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 966). “She already shares in the glory of her Son’s Resurrection, anticipating the resurrection of all members of His Body” (Catechism, 974). She has been “exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be more fully conformed to her son” (Catechism, 966). Her Assumption is a sign of sure hope that Jesus will raise us up to rejoice with Him forever. The Lord in His Word commands us to rejoice with Mary as she is honored today. Since Mary “is honored, all the members share her joy (1 Cor 12:26). We are to rejoice with her. Mary would be the first to proclaim: “Rejoice in the Lord always! I say it again. Rejoice!” (Phil 4:4).

Our Blessed Mother invites us today to always rejoice as she proclaims the ‘Magnificat’ in the gospel of today. Let us learn to act of giving thanksgiving thanks and praising God in all circumstances of our life. Mary Would have chosen to complain in the things she could not understand but rather, chose to ponder everything in her heart and turn to God for His Will to be done to her. Dear brothers and sisters, we have so much to thank God for in our lives. So, let us be people of faith and thanksgiving.

Let us continue to be mindful of the increase of the Delta Variant of Covid-19 in our cities. The Delta Variant of Covid-19 was declared a “variant of concern” by the World Health Organization in May. It also made clear that this variant is more transmissible, and causes more severe illness. Therefore, we continue to appeal to all parishioners to be cautious of this strain and to get vaccinated to protect themselves and others. Remember to keep our deceased parishioners and their families in your prayers this week. Remember to keep some of our parish families who lost their loved ones in your prayers.

### **~ La Solemnidad de la Asunción de la Santísima Virgen~**

MARÍA, CAUSA DE NUESTRA ALEGRÍA. María declara en Lucas 1:47, “Mi espíritu se alegra en Dios mi salvador.” La muy conocida oración, “Letanía de La Virgen,” se dirige a María como la “causa de nuestra alegría.” Este título de María es el más apropiado para la festividad de su Asunción al Cielo. Todo el ser de María se regocija en el Señor (Lc 1, 46). Ella difundió este gozo a otros, incluso al bebé nonato de Isabel, Juan, quien saltó "de alegría" al oír la voz de María mientras ella llevaba a Jesús en su vientre, a su hogar (Lc 1:44). María también estuvo presente en el aposento alto en Pentecostés (Hechos 1: 14ff) y seguramente se regocijó de gozo cuando su esposo, el Espíritu Santo, llenó a los apóstoles, quienes luego trajeron a tres mil personas a la Iglesia.

Finalmente, María “fue llevada en cuerpo y alma a la gloria celestial” (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, 966). “Ella ya comparte la gloria de la Resurrección de su Hijo, anticipando la resurrección de todos los miembros de Su Cuerpo” (Catecismo, 974). Ella ha sido “exaltada por el Señor como Reina sobre todas las cosas, para ser conformada más plenamente a su Hijo” (Catecismo, 966). Su Asunción es un signo de esperanza segura de que Jesús nos resucitará para regocijarnos con Él para siempre. El Señor en Su Palabra nos manda a regocijarnos con María como es honrada hoy. Dado que María “es honrada, todos los miembros comparten su alegría” (1 Co 12,26). Debemos regocijarnos con ella. María sería la primera en proclamar: “¡Alégrense en el Señor siempre! Lo digo de nuevo. ¡Alégrense!” (Filipenses 4: 4).

Nuestra Santísima Madre nos invita hoy a regocijarnos siempre mientras proclama el "Magnificat" en el evangelio de hoy. Aprendamos a actuar dando gracias y alabando a Dios en todas las circunstancias de nuestra vida. María hubiera optado por quejarse de las cosas que no podía entender, sin embargo, eligió ponderar todo en su corazón y volverse a Dios para que Él hiciera Su Voluntad. Queridos hermanos y hermanas, tenemos mucho que agradecer a Dios en nuestras vidas. Entonces, seamos personas de fe y de acción de gracias.

Sigamos siendo conscientes del aumento de la Variante Delta de Covid-19 en nuestras ciudades. La variante Delta de Covid-19 fue declarada una "variante preocupante" por la Organización Mundial de la Salud en mayo. También dejó en claro que esta variante es más transmisible y causa una enfermedad más grave. Por lo tanto, seguimos haciendo un llamamiento a todos los feligreses para que sean cautelosos con esta cepa y se vacunen para protegerse a sí mismos y a los demás. Recuerden mantener a nuestros feligreses fallecidos y sus familias en sus oraciones esta semana. Recuerden mantener en sus oraciones a las familias que en nuestra parroquia han perdido a sus seres queridos.
