At the Parish of St. Charles Borromeo, Resurrection and All Saints the congregation at our Churches are encouraged to return to in person attendance at Sunday Mass. From Sunday, September 12<sup>th</sup> until further notice we will continue to have two Masses each Sunday at St. Charles Borromeo in English and there will be two Masses each Sunday at Resurrection, one in Spanish and one in English. The 7:45 am. Mass at St. Charles will now be at 8:00 am.

At all Sunday Masses the following protocols are in place for the Parish of St. Charles Borromeo, Resurrection and All Saints: Masks are required to be worn during the Services.

Social distancing is also required. Sanitizing liquids are available when you enter our Churches and should be used.

At St. Charles Borromeo and Resurrection all are welcome at Mass. However, if you are elderly and have not been vaccinated against the Coronavirus, it is better for the unvaccinated elders to stay at home. If you are sick and have a fever, you are also encouraged to stay home, whether you are vaccinated or not. If you have an underlying health condition, like respiratory disease or heart disease or a compromised immune system or type 1 or type 2 diabetes, AND are not vaccinated, you should stay at home. Evidence suggests that this is for your own safety.

The Vatican has recently released the English text of Pope Francis' appeal for all people of goodwill to take any COVID-19 vaccine "authorized by the competent authorities." The global Covid-19 pandemic has affected all of us. Our Parish, in conjunction with the archdiocese will support His Holiness appeal by arranging for a NYC van to be stationed in front of St. Charles and Resurrection churches in the near future.

### **~ REFLECTION FOR THE TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME ~**

In the gospel of last week, Jesus reminded Peter and the other disciples to take up their daily crosses and follow him. Then, in the gospel of this Sunday, Jesus continued his teaching about the cross – there can be no share in God’s glory without the cross. When Jesus prophesied his own betrayal and crucifixion, it did not make any sense to his disciples because it did not fit their understanding of what the Messiah came to do. And they were afraid to ask further questions! Like a person who might receive a bad verdict from the doctor and then refuse to ask further questions, they too, didn’t want to know any more. How often do we reject what we do not wish to see? We have heard the good news of God’s word and we know the consequences of accepting it or rejecting it. And in most cases, we do not give the word of God our full allegiance and mold our lives according to it.

Even the disciples of Jesus failed to give the words of Jesus their full allegiance. This is primarily why they were arguing about who is the greatest. The same reason James spoke in the second reading (James 3:16-4:3) that greed and envy are at the root of conflict between people. How ashamed the disciples must have been when Jesus overheard them arguing about who among them was the greatest? In many ways and often times, we act like the disciples. We compare ourselves with others and desire their praise. The appetite for glory and greatness seems to be inbred in us. Who doesn’t cherish the ambition to be “somebody” whom others admire rather than a “nobody”? Even the psalms speak about the glory God has destined for us. You have made them a little lower than God and crowned them with glory and honor (Psalm 8:5).

Dear brothers and sisters, Jesus embraced a child to show us who really is the greatest in the kingdom of God. What can a little child teach us about greatness? Children in ancient world had no rights, position, or privileges of their own. They were socially at the “bottom of the rung” and at the service of their parents, much like the household staff and domestic servants. But Jesus elevated a little child in the presence of his disciples by placing the child in a privileged position of honor. This is to tell us that the greatest is the one who is humble and lowly of heart – who – instead of asserting their rights willingly empty themselves of pride and self-seeking glory by taking the lowly position of a servant or child. It is my prayer for us this week that we may learn to place the needs of others above our own needs and, learn how to be humble so as to become true followers of Christ, amen.

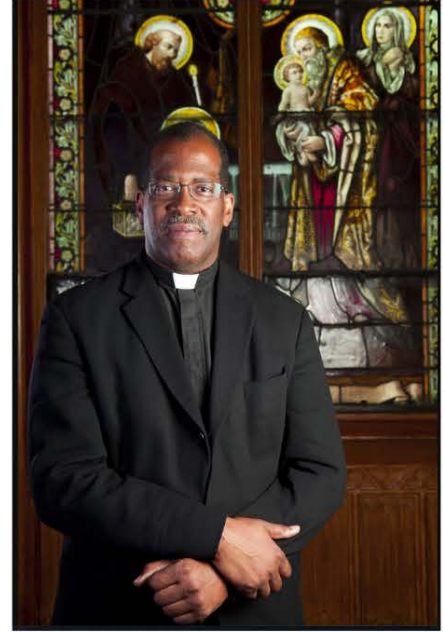
### **REFLEXIÓN PARA VIGÉSIMO QUINTO DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO**

En el evangelio de la semana pasada, Jesús le recuerda a Pedro y sus demás discípulos que tomen sus cruces diariamente y que lo sigan. Luego, en el evangelio de este domingo, Jesús continúa su enseñanza sobre la cruz: no puede haber participación en la gloria de Dios sin la cruz. Cuando Jesús profetizó su propia traición y crucifixión, no tuvo ningún sentido para sus discípulos porque no encajaba con su comprensión de lo que el Mesías vino a hacer. ¡Y tenían miedo de hacer más preguntas! Como una persona que podría recibir un mal veredicto del doctor y luego negarse a hacer más preguntas, ellos tampoco querían saber más. ¿Con qué frecuencia rechazamos lo que no deseamos ver? Hemos escuchado la Buena Nueva de la palabra de Dios y conocemos las consecuencias de aceptarla o rechazarla. Y en la mayoría de los casos, no le damos a la palabra de Dios toda nuestra lealtad y no moldeamos nuestras vidas de acuerdo con ella.

Incluso los discípulos de Jesús fallaron en dar a la palabra de Jesús toda su lealtad. Esta es principalmente la razón por la que estaban discutiendo sobre quién es el más grande. La misma razón por la que Santiago habló en la segunda lectura (Santiago 3: 16-4: 3) de que la codicia y la envidia son la raíz del conflicto entre las personas. ¿Cuán avergonzados deben haber estado los discípulos cuando Jesús los escuchó discutir sobre quién de ellos era el más grande? De muchas formas y muchas veces actuamos como los discípulos. Nos comparamos con los demás y deseamos sus elogios. El apetito por la gloria y la grandeza parece ser innato en nosotros. ¿Quién no aprecia la ambición de ser "alguien" a quien otros admiran en lugar de ser "nadie"? Incluso los Salmos hablan de la gloria que Dios ha destinado para nosotros. Los has hecho un poco más bajos que Dios, y los has coronado de gloria y honor. (Salmo 8: 5).

Queridos hermanos y hermanas, Jesús abrazó a un niño para mostrarnos quién es realmente el más grande en el reino de Dios. ¿Qué puede enseñarnos un niño pequeño sobre la grandeza? Los niños del mundo antiguo no tenían derechos, posición o privilegios propios. Estaban socialmente "en la parte inferior del peldaño" y al servicio de sus padres, al igual que el personal doméstico y las empleadas domésticas. Pero Jesús elevó a un niño en presencia de sus discípulos colocando al niño en una posición privilegiada de honor. Esto es para decirnos que el más grande es el que es humilde y humilde de corazón, quien, en lugar de hacer valer sus derechos, se despoja voluntariamente del orgullo y la gloria egoísta al tomar la humilde posición de un sirviente o un niño. Es mi oración para nosotros esta semana que podamos aprender a colocar las necesidades de los demás por encima de nuestras propias necesidades y aprender a ser humildes para convertirnos en verdaderos seguidores de Cristo. Amén.

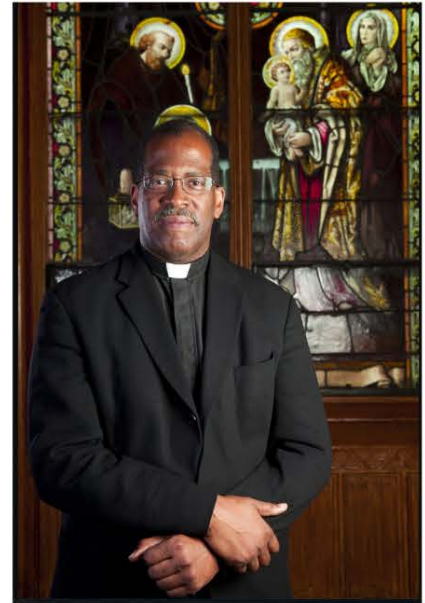

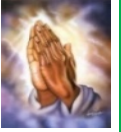

## Protocols for Fr. Chisholm's Farewell Mass



*On Sunday, September 26, the Parish will be honoring our beloved pastor, Father Gregory Chisholm, SJ for his 10 years of dedicated service to our Parish and the Harlem Community. Time is quickly approaching, and we are happy to announce a celebration held in his honor. We are anticipating a greater number of attendees than usual. Whenever there is an event of this magnitude, and notwithstanding the pandemic, safety and security protocols must be in place so keep everyone safe. That said, the following directives will be strictly enforced:*

### **1. COVID PROTOCOLS**

COVID protocols remain in place for the Parish of St. Charles Borromeo, Resurrection and All Saints: For contact tracing, **ALL** attendees must be checked in, temperatures will be taken, masks are required to be worn during the Services, social distancing is also required. Sanitizing liquids are available when you enter our Churches and **ARE** to be used.

We are anticipating reaching the maximum seating capacity at the 10 am Mass. Therefore, we are encouraging those of you who wish to obtain a seat in the church, to attend the 8:00 a.m. Mass. Furthermore, we are asking you to limit your reservations to attending 1 Mass and 1 social event to provide the maximum amount of people the opportunity to bid Fr. Chisholm blessed journey.

### **3. SEATING---the following seating arrangements will be strictly enforced:**

#### A. St. Charles Borromeo---

At the 8:00 a.m. Mass, there will be **150** seats available in the church.
