Did you know....

- That the Central Harlem Vicariate is no longer in existence?
- On October 1, 2021, Cardinal Dolan issued a decree made public on the archdiocese website (archny.org) that day, reorganizing the deaneries in the Archdiocese of New York and reducing their number from 19 to 12?
- The Parish of St. Charles, Resurrection and All Saints are now located in the North Manhattan Deanery which consists of 21 parishes?
- Auxiliary Bishop Edmund J. Whalen is currently serving as dean?
- Fr. Gregory Chisholm, the former Pastor and Dean of Central Harlem, expressed concerns about this news and the potential impact this could have on Black Catholics here in Harlem?
- That “an updated list of deans in the archdiocese will be published in a subsequent issue of Catholic New York?”

Do you know...

- Who the Parish Lay Trustees are? **The Trustees are** Ron Lawson and Tyson Boudreaux. They assist the pastor in his oversight of parish management. Faithful exercise of the trustees' fiduciary duties of care and loyalty to the parish includes providing active, independent, and informed reviews of all major decisions about the funds and property of the parish. The trustees review the Annual Financial Report, preferably during their annual November meeting. The lay trustees, recommended by the Pastor, are elected for a one-year term and may be re-elected for up to three-consecutive terms.
- Who the Members of the Parish Finance Council are? **The Members are** Ronald Lawson (Trustee), Tyson Boudreaux (Trustee), Beverly Riddick, Deborah Harris, Tanya Lewis, and Paul Tchamambe.
- The Parish finance council is a mandated body having an advisory and consultative role with the pastor? The Council may provide expertise in developing an annual budget and then analyzing actual financial activities against the budget. It may also be of assistance in evaluating the system of internal controls and recommending improvements in safeguarding assets such as Sunday collections and expenditures of parish finances.
- Who the Members of the Parish Council are? **The Members are:** Ex Officio, Fr. Timothy Wiggins, Fr. - ¿Quiénes son los fideicomisarios laicos parroquiales? Los fideicomisarios son Ron Lawson y Tyson Boudreaux. Ayudan al párroco en su supervisión de la gestión Parroquial. El ejercicio fiel de los deberes fiduciarios de cuidado y lealtad de los fideicomisarios a la parroquia incluye proporcionar revisiones activas, independientes e informadas de todas las decisiones importantes sobre los fondos y la propiedad de la parroquia. Los fideicomisarios revisan el Informe Financiero Anual, preferiblemente durante su reunión anual de noviembre. Los fideicomisarios laicos, recomendados por el pastor, son elegidos por un período de un año y pueden ser reelegidos por hasta tres períodos consecutivos.

También puede ser de ayuda para evaluar el sistema de controles internos y recomendar mejoras en la protección de bienes tales como colectas dominicales y gastos de las finanzas parroquiales.

Reflection for the Thirty – First Sunday in Ordinary Time

Who is the Priest?

The dictionary tells us that a priest is someone who offers a gift to a god in his or her own name and the name of others. So, we rightly ask, who is the Christian priest? The answer of course, is Jesus, God the Son, and Second Person of the Trinity, offered the gift of himself to God the Father when he decided as St. Paul tells us in the Letter to the Philippians, “to empty himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness, and found in human appearance, he humbled himself if becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross.” (Phil. 2:7-8)

In our second reading today from the Letter of Hebrews the author tells us that Jesus, because he remains forever, has a priesthood which does not pass away. When did Jesus offer himself to God the Father? In his incarnation, nine months prior to his birth on Christmas over two-thousand years ago. Our faith tells us that Jesus began his priesthood and continued to offer himself to God throughout his life, especially culminating in his death on the Cross; and that He continues to offer himself for us all to God the Father forever! Jesus lives forever to make intercession for us.

Because we are baptized and enter into the life of Jesus Christ, we too can share in this priesthood of Jesus in offering with him his gift of himself. (What are we doing today at Mass?) So back to the original question, who is the Priest? The answer is Jesus and every baptized person who joins with Jesus in offering him to the Father.

Some few of us have been called by the Christian community of baptized people to lead us all in our worship today. As baptized and ordained followers of Jesus Christ they lead us all in the praise of God to thank God for God’s goodness to us all. God sent his Son; the Son willingly accepted this mission of becoming one of us and continues to offer himself for the rest of us are sinners. Jesus is the Priest!

Reflexión Para El Trigésimo Primer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

¿Quién es el sacerdote?

El diccionario nos dice que un sacerdote es alguien que ofrece un regalo a un dios en su propio nombre y en el nombre de otros. Entonces, preguntamos con razón, ¿quién es el sacerdote cristiano? La respuesta, por supuesto, es Jesús, Dios Hijo y Segunda Persona de la Trinidad, ofreció el don de sí mismo a Dios Padre cuando decidió, como nos dice San Pablo en la Carta a los Filipenses, “vaciarse, tomar en forma de esclavo, viniendo en semejanza humana, y encontrado en apariencia humana, se humilló a sí mismo si se volvía obediente hasta la muerte, incluso la muerte en la cruz.” (Filipenses 2: 7-8)

En nuestra segunda lectura de hoy de la Carta de los Hebreos, el autor nos dice que Jesús, porque permanece para siempre, tiene un sacerdocio que no pasa. ¿Cuándo se ofreció Jesús a Dios Padre? En su encarnación, nueve meses antes de su nacimiento en Navidad hace más de dos mil años. Nuestra fe nos dice que Jesús comenzó su sacerdocio y continuó ofreciéndose a Dios durante toda su vida, culminando especialmente con su muerte en la Cruz; ¡y que Él continúa ofreciéndose a sí mismo por todos nosotros a Dios Padre para siempre! Jesús vive para siempre para interceder por nosotros.

Debido a que somos bautizados y entramos en la vida de Jesucristo, también nosotros podemos participar de este sacerdocio de Jesús al ofrecerle el don de sí mismo. (¿Qué estamos haciendo hoy en la Misa?) Entonces, volviendo a la pregunta original, ¿quién es el sacerdote? La respuesta es Jesús y todo bautizado que se une a Jesús para ofrecerse al Padre.

Algunos de nosotros hemos sido llamados por la comunidad cristiana de personas bautizadas para guiarnos a todos en nuestra adoración hoy. Como seguidores bautizados y ordenados de Jesucristo, nos guían a todos en la alabanza de Dios para agradecer a Dios por la bondad de Dios para con todos nosotros. Dios envió a su Hijo; el Hijo aceptó de buen grado esta misión de convertirse en uno de nosotros y continúa ofreciéndose por el resto de nosotros que somos pecadores. ¡Jesús es el sacerdote!

ALL SAINTS DAY, ---November 1st

*This Year the Feast of All Saints falls on a Monday and is **not** a holy day of obligation. As you may recall, the US Bishops have decree that when a holy day of obligation falls on either a Saturday or Monday, there is no obligation to attend Mass. Therefore, our mass schedule is the same as a regular Monday morning, 8:30 a.m.(livestream)*

THE COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED (ALL SOULS' DAY) --- November 2nd

All Souls' Day is unique on the liturgical calendar. Neither a solemnity nor a feast, this commemoration outranks other feasts and even takes the place of a Sunday in Ordinary Time (should this commemoration fall on a Sunday). Prayer for the dead reaches deep into our human history and it has been our custom from the earliest days of the church. The belief that our prayers and be of assistance to the dead is a treasured tenet of our Catholic faith. We profess it every time we recite the Nicene Creed; "I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come."

All Souls Novenas: During November, we are called in a special way to pray for the souls of those who have gone before us in faith. We recall the goodness of our family members, friends, coworkers, benefactors, fellow-parishioners.

We will have a Novena of Masses of Remembrance, nine Masses for your intentions, which will begin on Tuesday, November 2 Envelopes to list your beloved dead are to your offertory boxes or on the tables at the entrance of the church. Envelopes will remain on the altar for the entire month of November. Please return them by October 31st. We will not have the Book of the Dead as in past years. Masses on All Souls Day are:

8:30 AM Mass at SCB (School Mass)

7:00 PM Mass at SCB (English)

7:00 PM Mass at Resurrection (Bi-lingual)

During the evening Masses, we will pray for All Souls lost during the COVID-19 Pandemic and the names of those Deceased Parishioners who were buried out of the Parish from November 2, 2020 - November 1, 2021.

We will also have a Virtual All Souls Novena hosted by the Parish's Lazarus Project, our ministry of consolation beginning Tuesday, November 2 at 8:30 p.m. For more information, please see the separate flyer that follows this announcement.

At the Baptismal font will be a list of those souls who were buried out of St. Charles Borromeo and Resurrection from November 2, 2020---November 2, 2021.

At the Blessed Mother's altar, we will have the Table of Remembrance. Parishioners are invited to place framed pictures of their beloved dead, which will remain in place during the month of November.

No es una solemnidad ni una fiesta, esta conmemoración supera a otras fiestas e incluso toma el lugar de un Domingo en el Tiempo Ordinario (si esta conmemoración cayera en domingo). La oración por los muertos penetra profundamente en nuestra historia humana y ha sido nuestra costumbre desde los primeros días de la iglesia. La creencia de que nuestras oraciones y ser de ayuda a los muertos es un preciado principio de nuestra Fe Católica. Lo profesamos cada vez que recitamos el Credo de Niceno; "Espero la resurrección de los muertos y la vida del mundo futuro".

Novena de Todos los fieles Difuntos: Durante noviembre, somos llamados de una manera especial a orar por las almas de aquellos que nos han precedido en la fe. Recordamos la bondad de nuestros familiares, amigos, compañeros de trabajo, benefactores, feligreses.
