“Believers witness to the presence and word of Jesus in the world and are a continuing sign of the Kingdom of God, which is present both in and through Jesus, and still to come to its fullness through the power of the Holy Spirit ” (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, *Fulfilled in Your Hearing*, p. 6).

Believers often tell the story of faith in hindsight. In painful times it may be difficult to see the hand of God. This is true in the story from Ezekiel the prophet we hear in the First Reading. When the Israelites experienced many of their people being taken off into exile by the Babylonians, they were desolate and turned to Egypt rather than to God to be saved. They experienced another destruction of their land and people by Babylonia and finally began to realize that it was their unfaithfulness that caused their suffering and loss.

The prophet reminded them that God promised never to abandon them. Using the image of a cedar tree, he told them God would save a remnant of the exiles, placing a tender shoot on high on the mountain to dwell in majesty. Their God is so powerful that even a withered, lowly, almost dead branch will prosper and bloom.

Ezekiel told the Israelites to practice faithfulness, trust God, and fulfill their part of the covenant. A new twig will sprout, connecting to the coming Messiah from the sprout of David’s tree, or lineage. The new king will practice the true virtues of a king: humility, faithfulness to the covenant, and concern for the least for whom God cares.

Jesus often used common experiences to help people understand his teachings, and he used images for God and his kingdom. In the first parable we hear in today’s Gospel reading, we do not understand how a seed grows and produces; but that is how the reign of God manifests itself. In the second, the kingdom of God is like the smallest of seeds, but becomes so large that birds build nests in the shade of its branches.

Sometimes the term “kingdom of God causes us to imagine a place, perhaps associated with heaven, and we all aspire to that kingdom. Scripture scholars also translate kingdom as reign which may convey a broader image than a specific place. Jesus speaks about the kingdom of God as a way of being or following God’s way. If we believe and practice a way of life, then God’s reign would look like this.

The image helps us understand our role in this. Our work is to proclaim this kingdom of God by demonstrating through our actions toward God and one another that we are true followers. Like the palm and cedar trees, like the mustard seed and the seed upon the ground, we show the fruits of our belief here on earth in our treatment of one another, in the way we practice justice and peace, and in the way we right our relationships with our sisters and brothers.

**Fortnight for Freedom
June 21 to July 4**

The annual *Fortnight for Freedom: Freedom to Bear Witness* sponsored by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops will take place from June 21 to July 4, 2015, a time when our liturgical calendar celebrates a series of great martyrs who remained faithful in the face of persecution by political power — St. Thomas More and St. John Fisher, St. John the Baptist, SS. Peter and Paul, and the First Martyrs of the Church of Rome. The theme of this year's Fortnight will focus on the "freedom to bear witness" to the truth of the Gospel.

Put a "Save the Date" on your calendars for Monday, June 29, for a very special event. Justin Anderson, Assistant Professor of Moral Theology at Immaculate Conception Seminary/School of Theology at Seton Hall University will present a talk at 7:30 p.m. in the Church Hall, followed by a Q&A session. We are still working out the details, but Professor Anderson's talk will probably focus on the Church's public position that equal legal standing should not be granted to same-sex couples as is granted to heterosexual couples. He will focus on what the Magisterium teaches regarding the

issue at hand and how the Church's teaching is an extension of a broader issue.

Please plan on joining fellow parishioners for what promises to be a fascinating evening.

FOR CHILDREN AND YOUTH**

1. **SCREENING of staff / volunteers.**
2. Adults trained in safe environment strategies and signs of abuse.
3. **Code of conduct enforced.**
4. Open **Communication** between parents and staff / staff and children / children and parents.
5. **Parents always Welcome.**
6. Children educated in right relationships & what to do if a relationship isn't right.
7. **All children treated with Dignity and Respect.**
8. Clear Rules and Expectations. Consistent reinforcement / consequences.
9. **Adequate supervision of youth.** Team approach – accountability – no 1:1 isolation.
10. All abuse is reported.
