The Reason for Gifts

Look around your church and you will see many gifts. You will see those who sing and those who read, those who preach and those who greet. You will see some who feed the hungry and others who serve on committees. You will see some who decorate and others who converse. Some have a gift for leading prayer, for parenting children, or for making people feel at home. Everybody has some gift.

Still, not all gifts are equal. Some people excel at their gifts. Others exercise them less capably. The quality of the gift is not that important. It is important to exercise the gift, whatever its extent may be. The use of our gifts releases the power of the Spirit.

St. Paul wrote to the Corinthians, "To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit."

God gives gifts for a reason. They are meant to be nurtured and used. The gifts manifest the Spirit. When used properly, they draw attention to God who gives, not to the person who has received.

The manifold gifts within one community show the marvels of the Holy Spirit. When people share their gifts, they create a spirit of selflessness and inspire others to service. They help everyone appreciate the goodness of God, who gives even before we ask.

When people look at you, they also see gifts. For which gifts are you most grateful? How do you share them?

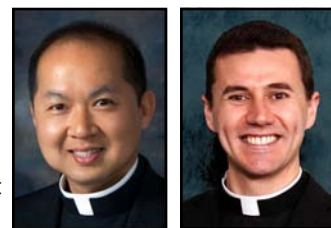

Congratulations Mr. Farley!

Our parish school is very happy to continue the tradition of presenting the Nagle Award, an annual honor bestowed upon a teacher who, as described in essays written by students, brings to life the ideals of truth, service, family and peace in his or her work as a Catholic School teacher. These words are displayed on our school crest, along with a lantern and remind us of a special woman named Nano Nagle, who gave up a very comfortable life to help Catholic children learn to read, write and practice their faith. Nano was known as the Lady with the Lantern because she acted as a spark of light in a very dark time when it was illegal to practice the Catholic faith. Others joined Nano in this beautiful ministry and eventually she began an order of nuns called the Sister of the Presentation; the same sisters who opened this school in 1965.

This year's recipient—P.E. teacher Mr. Steve Farley—was described consistently by students as kind, encouraging, helpful, honest and happy. Many students described how this teacher encourages students to work hard. Finally, this simple yet beautiful statement from one of our littlest students: "This teacher is fun and makes me happy."

R.C.I.A.

Our Neophytes have now completed their RCIA formation and are becoming active members of St. Norbert Parish. A new Inquiry group is forming for those wishing to begin the process of becoming a Catholic, and for those who are not yet ready to make a commitment, but would like to investigate the teachings of the Church further.

Inquiry sessions take place on Thursday evenings from 7:30 to 9 in the Ministry Center Library. The Inquiry groups are casual meetings to answer initial questions that people may have, to reflect upon God's presence throughout their lives, and to begin to become familiar with the Sunday scripture readings. A Study of World Religions

Have you ever wondered how different religions understand God and celebrate human spirituality? During the summer months we will offer a course on Comparative Religion which, in an atmosphere of respect, will explore the religious response to humanity's relationship with God in Christianity, Judaism, Islam, Buddhism, Hinduism, Polytheism and lesser known ancient and modern religions. We will be looking at the religious texts held sacred by different religions, the founders, prophets, and religious leaders in history, the rituals and symbols, and methods prayer and meditation. The course will be presented through recorded DVD talks by Professor Charles Kimball, Professor of Religious Studies at the University of Oklahoma. Each presentation will include group discussion time, and a small handbook offering the principle elements of the major world religions will be available to participants.

We will meet on Wednesday evenings, beginning on **June 25**, at 7:30 in the Ministry Center Library. The course will continue through the end of September with a two week break at the half-way point at the beginning of August. This should be an interest to anyone who is curious about other cultures, and how people of other religious traditions understand God.

Wondering Why

Pentecost was a busy time in ancient Jerusalem. It was one of the three pilgrimage feasts, the others being Passover and Succoth, when Jews from throughout Palestine and many neighboring nations would come to the Temple in Jerusalem to offer sacrifice. Every Jew was expected to visit Jerusalem at least once in his lifetime, and generally that would be in connection with one of these feast days.

Pentecost occurred fifty days after the Passover celebration, in the middle of spring. Originally it was a harvest festival when the first fruits of the trees and the first grains of the fields would be sacrificed as an offering of thanksgiving for the goodness and abundance of God. In the story of Pentecost which we hear in

today's reading from Acts, Jerusalem is crowded with Jews from many nations who have come to worship and offer their thanksgiving sacrifices.

The disciples, however, are locked up in a room not far from the Temple. They are afraid to be in public and unsure what they should do. Jesus told them to go forth to preach and baptize, but they are afraid...afraid of the Jews and of the Romans who put Jesus to death and who might arrest and execute them too. So, they pray, and while at prayer something extraordinary happens. In the Book of Acts, Luke describes it as the sound of wind and something like fire that descends upon them. He is using theophany symbols often used in the Old Testament scriptures to designate an encounter with God. Wind and fire have energy and power and when this phenomenon is experienced by the disciples they also are energized and given power. They go out into the streets of Jerusalem to preach and astound everyone because people hear them speaking in their own native languages, even though those hearing their words came from many different places. This is a sign of the healing of the curse of Babel in the Old Testament when the languages of peoples were confused because of their pride. The power of God brings people back into unity and makes God's grace available to all. We are told that 3000 people believed the Good News the Apostles preached and were baptized that same day.

Throughout this Easter season, which ends today, many young people and adults throughout our diocese have been confirmed in faith. At their confirmation the congregation prays for them to receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit. These gifts are those spoken of by the Prophet Isaiah as the signs by which the Messiah will be recognized. They are the gifts of wisdom, understanding, counsel, courage, knowledge, reverence and awe in the presence of God. These are gifts that Jesus had as the Messiah, a Hebrew title meaning "the anointed one" that is translated as Christ in Greek. When we are confirmed we are also anointed with the Sacred Chrism, which imparts to our spirits those same gifts of which Isaiah spoke, and Jesus lived. We become more like Christ, which is why we are called Christians – anointed ones.

For all those whom our Church has confirmed this year, we ask that the gifts given to them will grow in fruitful ways. And we give thanks on this Pentecost, this feast of the first fruits, for the fruits of the harvest of the church, those who have made the choice to follow Christ, to be disciples, and to live the Gifts of the Holy Spirit in all the areas of their lives.

Reflexionemos sobre la Palabra de Dios

Los discípulos tenían mucho miedo y con las puertas de la casa cerradas. El miedo tiene maneras de encarcelarnos y alejarnos del mundo exterior lo mismo que de nuestro mundo interior, y así nos desproveen de nuestra libertad para tener esperanza, imaginación y sueños.

Podemos llegar a sentirnos cómodos trabajando en espacios estrechos, estando aislados y desencarnados, lejos de la vida y del contacto con los demás. Pero entonces llega el Señor resucitado con sus brazos extendidos, su corazón abierto y trayendo dones que van a transformar nuestra vida. El primer don del Señor resucitado es la paz o *shalom*, que significa todo lo bueno que se necesita, ya sea físico, mental o espiritual, para tener vida interior. Esta paz es un don que el mundo no puede dar.

El segundo don es una misión: Somos enviados como Jesús fue enviado por el Padre. ¿Adónde? Al mundo. Pues, “tanto amó Dios al mundo que le dio a su Hijo único, para que todo el que crea en él no perezca, sino que tenga vida eterna. Dios no envió a su Hijo al mundo para condenarlo, sino para salvarlo por medio de él” (Juan 3:16–17). Ahora el Hijo envía a sus discípulos (¡también a nosotros!) para ofrecer vida.

El tercer don es el Espíritu Santo, para el perdón de los pecados. El Espíritu Santo es el don del Padre y del Hijo, que hemos recibido en nuestro bautismo y de nuevo en nuestra confirmación. Y los dones del Espíritu Santo se le dan a la Iglesia y a sus miembros para beneficio de todos, ya estén dentro o fuera de la Iglesia. Entre todos esos dones el primordial es el perdón.

Alerta: Servicios de Inmigración Fraudulentos

Se nos ha informado que se han ofrecido servicios de inmigración fraudulentos a feligreses en nuestras parroquias, y en sus casas y vecindarios. Un grupo que se autodenomina Estudiantes Universitarios Católicos de América, “University Catholic Students of America”, ha estado vendiendo un DVD que afirma que ayudará a recién inmigrados y a indocumentados a navegar el proceso de naturalización. Algunos feligreses confiados de nuestras parroquias han comprado el DVD por más de \$200 – y nunca reciben ni el DVD ni más información. Este grupo también está recabando información bajo el supuesto de proporcionar becas para estudiantes hispanos y van de casa en casa perpetrando este fraude. También han afirmado que están afiliados con Caridades Católicas.

El único proveedor de servicios de inmigración, naturalización y reubicación que está aprobado para promover sus servicios en nuestras parroquias es Caridades Católicas del Condado de Orange.

El Centro de Reubicación/Refugiados, Inmigración y Ciudadanía de Caridades Católicas está certificado por la Junta de Apelaciones sobre Inmigración y ayuda a clientes con las solicitudes de naturalización, ajuste de estado, peticiones de familiares, unidad familiar, reunificación familiar, visas de estudiantes y una serie de servicios adicionales. También ofrecen clases de ciudadanía gratuitas las cuales se llevan a cabo tres veces al mes en el centro.
