I Can Wait

In today's reading Saint James urges us to be patient. "Make your hearts firm," he says, "because the coming of



the Lord is at hand" (James 5:8). "Being patient" means enduring without complaint. The farmer mentioned in today's Gospel cannot make the harvest arrive ahead of schedule, but must wait for the sun, the rain, and the good earth to do their work. Yet while the plants are growing there are tasks to be done in the effort to ensure a good crop, such as weeding, fertilizing, and keeping away pests. Thus it is in Advent: God is sending us a savior, but we must prepare for his coming. Children, however, are born impatient. Having their needs met translates into survival and helps them establish bonds with those who love and care for them. As children grow, they learn valuable lessons in tolerance and understanding when they do not get what they want right away. Everyone has seen toddlers who "melt down" when they have to wait for something. It is more unsettling to see this same behavior in older children or adults, but it happens if they have not learned patience. If we have children, Advent is a yearly opportunity to teach patience. The Church tells to wait four weeks—a long time for children. Many families use Advent calendars and Bible story books to focus their children on the day-by-day unfolding of this season. They take their children to an Advent penance service and help them to choose gifts for people named on the parish giving tree. They light the candles on the Advent wreath before meals and say special prayers together. The family time spent savoring each bit of movement over God's good time helps children see the importance of waiting, watching, and learning.

This **Thursday, December 15**, we will discuss the Incarnation and the Virgin Birth of Jesus. RCIA and Inquiry sessions will not meet on **December 22 or 29**, but will resume on Thursday evening, January 5, when Fr. Bruce will talk about why Mary is called the Mother of God.

Anyone desiring to become a Catholic is welcome to begin the Inquiry Process on Thursday evenings at 7:30. Inquiry sessions are available year-round, except for holidays, and new participants are welcome at any time. Whether you have decided to become a Catholic, wish to learn more about the Church, or just have questions that you would like to discuss, we encourage you to join us. There is no obligation at this stage of the RCIA process, but for those who desire to continue to the reception of sacraments, the process usually takes a minimum of one year.

New DVD/Discussion Series in January

Bishop Robert Barron, producer of the series *Catholicism*, has released the first volume of his new series, *Catholicism: the Pivotal Players*, which we will view and discuss over six weeks beginning **Tuesday, January 17**. In the first collection, Bishop Barron reviews the lives, theology and lasting contributions of St. Francis of Assisi, St. Catherine of Siena, St. Thomas Aquinas, the Renaissance artist Michelangelo, English convert and Bishop Blessed John Henry Newman, and the English Professor and Theologian G. K. Chesterton. Like his previous program, *Catholicism*, much of this series is filmed on location where the subjects of his presentations lived and worked.

What Was Happening in the Eleventh Century?

One of the greatest controversies of this century was the question of lay investiture, of someone other than ecclesiastical authorities choosing who should be placed in church offices, and investing them with the vestments and symbols of their office. In the earliest church, these decisions were made by the Apostles and their immediate successors. Those chosen to serve the church in leadership roles were selected by the apostles and bishops, usually based on the desire of the community, and given authority through the laying on of hands. We see this verified in Acts of the Apostles, and in Paul's letters to Timothy and Titus.

After Christianity became legal under Constantine, and increasingly when it became the official religion of the Roman Empire under Theodosius, Emperors began making the appointments of Bishops, although the approval of the regional Patriarch was a condition of the appointment, those Patriarchs often did not in actuality have much choice other than to approve the Emperors' wishes. As time moved on, not only the Emperors of the West and of the East were making clerical appointments, but also lesser Kings, Princes, Dukes and other lay persons of authority. After the fall of the Roman Empire, when religious and

secular authority often became conflated, many sons of royal or noble families became both high ranking clerics, and high ranking secular leaders. Along with this came the issues of simony, selling the office of Bishop to a wealthy candidate who desired it, and of nepotism, of giving these offices to family members.

Politics also played a role, as church appointments were given to men who would be loyal to the king or noble who gave it to them. Simony, nepotism, and lay investiture all led to inappropriate persons being given authority in the Church, often in powerful offices of Archbishop or even Pope. And, not surprisingly, this led to corruption, as was obvious in the tenth century reign of John XII, which was addressed in an earlier article.

Reformers within the Church wanted to remove the authority to appoint clerical offices from the lay nobility and return it to the Church. The first step was to eliminate the practice of the Holy Roman Emperor appointing the Pope. An opportunity to act came in 1056, when Henry IV became Holy Roman Emperor as a very young child. Three years later, a church Council held in Rome, issued a document declaring that leaders of the nobility no longer had authority to appoint church offices, and established the College of Cardinals, giving to them the obligation to select the pope.

In 1075, Pope Gregory VII issued a document, *Dictatus Papae*, which asserted that because the Church was founded by God, the Pope was the only person with universal authority, and that he had the authority to depose an emperor, thereby giving the church power over the state. Another local Council, declared that the Pope alone had the authority to appoint Bishops or to decide over which diocese they would rule. By this time, Henry was in his mid-twenties and was not pleased at the Pope claiming to have more power than did the Emperor, himself. He continued to appoint Bishops and assign them, and wrote a letter to Pope Gregory rejecting this teaching. The Pope responded by excommunicating Henry and deposing him, releasing the people from their oath of allegiance to him, which included their obligation to follow the Emperor's laws and to pay taxes.

German aristocrats took this papal declaration as an excuse to begin a rebellion, taking property and peasants and creating personal fiefdoms, constructing their own fortified castles, which had been forbidden by German law. This forced Henry into a position where he had to recant. He declared himself penitent, and dressed in sack cloth, walked barefoot through the winter snow to Canossa in the Italian Alps to meet with the Pope and ask for absolution. He was made to wait four days before Gregory would grant him an audience, but, then, kneeling on the snow covered ground, the excommunication was lifted, and Henry IV was given absolution by Pope Gregory VII.

And, so, the history of the Church continues . . .

Puedo Esperar

En la segunda lectura de hoy Santiago nos insiste a ser pacientes.

“Mantengan firme el ánimo, porque la venida del Señor está cerca” (Santiago 5:8). “Ser paciente” significa perseverar sin quejarse. El labrador que menciona Santiago no puede hacer que la cosecha se dé antes de tiempo, sino que debe esperar el sol, la lluvia y la tierra buena para que brote el fruto. No obstante, mientras que las plantas crecen hay tareas que hacer para asegurar que lo que se cultivó se logre, como arrancar hierbas malas, fertilizar y espantar los insectos. Así sucede en el Adviento: Dios nos envía un Salvador, pero nosotros debemos prepararnos para su venida. Hay que tener en cuenta, sin embargo, que todos nacemos impacientes. En nuestra niñez nuestras necesidades nos ayudan a establecer vínculos con aquellos que nos aman y nos atienden. A medida que crecemos vamos aprendiendo invaluable lecciones de tolerancia y comprensión cuando no podemos conseguir enseguida lo que queremos. Todos hemos visto a algún niño pequeño que se emberrenchina cuando tiene que esperar por algo que quiere. Este comportamiento se hace más inquietante si lo vemos en niños mayores o en adultos, pero así sucede si no se ha aprendido a tener paciencia. Si tenemos niños, el Adviento es una buena oportunidad que se nos da todos los años para enseñar la paciencia. La Iglesia dice que esperemos cuatro semanas—un tiempo bien largo para los niños. Muchas familias usan calendarios de Adviento y libros con relatos bíblicos para poner la atención de los niños en cómo se va desarrollando este tiempo día a día; llevan a sus hijos a una celebración comunitaria de reconciliación y escogen nombres de un árbol que pone la parroquia con el fin expreso de comprar un regalo para esas personas. También encienden las velas de la corona de Adviento antes de las comidas y rezan juntos oraciones especiales para este tiempo. El tiempo que se pasa en familia recordando y regocijándose en la bondad infinita de Dios ayuda a los niños para que comprendan la importancia de esperar, perseverar y aprender.

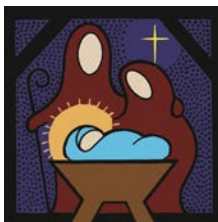

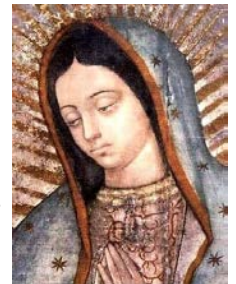
