Star Gazers

Around a thousand years ago a stonemason in Autun, France, was working on decorations for the city's new cathedral. One of his carvings shows a charming scene. The three kings, all wearing crowns and sharing one cozy bed, are being awakened by an angel pointing to a star. The angel's finger is gently touching the hand of one of the kings on top of the patterned coverlet. This king's eyes have popped open in surprise, while the other two slumber on. The stonemason artistically combined two biblical stories into one. The star reminds us of the one that led the kings to Bethlehem, while the visiting angel refers to the warning they received in a dream not to return to Herod after visiting the Christ Child. For centuries tradition has held that the names of the kings were Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar, but nobody really knows for sure. Other traditions call them wise men from the East who studied the stars. They were the first non-Jews to recognize and worship the Son of God and give him kingly gifts. In the Middle Ages, houses were blessed on Epiphany, reflecting how the magi found Christ "on entering the house." Try reviving this ancient tradition today. It can work for any family or household group. One person incenses the house while another sprinkles holy water, and a third writes in chalk over every outside doorway "20 + C + M + B + 11" (or whatever the year may be), which stands for "The three Holy Kings, Caspar, Melchior, Balthasar, in the year of Our Lord 2011." The letters C, M, and B also stand for *Christus mansionem benedicat*, "May Christ bless this home." Blessing the doorways symbolizes the family's commitment to welcome everyone as Christ into their home throughout the year.

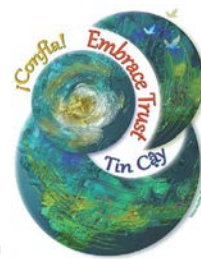
PSA 2017 Coming Soon

There is no obligation at this stage of the RCIA process, but for those who desire to continue to the reception of sacraments, the process usually takes a minimum of one year.

New DVD/Discussion Series in January

Bishop Robert Barron, producer of the series *Catholicism*, has released the first volume of his new series, *Catholicism: the Pivotal Players*, which we will view and discuss over six weeks beginning **Tuesday, January 17**. In the first collection, Bishop Barron reviews the lives, theology and lasting contributions of St. Francis of Assisi, St. Catherine of Siena, St. Thomas Aquinas, the Renaissance artist Michelangelo, English convert and Bishop Blessed John Henry Newman, and the English Professor and Theologian G. K. Chesterton. Like his previous program, *Catholicism*, much of this series is filmed on location where the subjects of his presentations lived and worked.

What Was Happening in the Eleventh Century?

The Byzantine Empire was declining and under assault by Islamic armies, which had taken their toll over the past four centuries. In 1095, Emperor Alexius I called upon Pope Urban II to help him in defending the eastern empire from the Seljuk Turks. Later that same year, Urban declared the first of the great crusades, with the intent to free the cities of Antioch and Jerusalem from Islamic rule.

But, the idea was a complicated result of many factors which had been building since the time of Charlemagne. After the conversion of the Scandinavian territories, the Slavs, and the Hungarian tribes, borders of nations in Europe became more defined and secure, leaving large hoards of trained military personnel with little to do except feud against each other. The Church tried to control these conflicts of feudal lord against feudal lord by instituting a movement called "The Peace and Truce of God." Under these conditions, knights and other warriors were forbidden from attacking vulnerable persons, unarmed persons,

and from looting, stealing, or destroying crops or property within their own nations. It became part of the code of chivalry to which the knights would bind themselves by oath. Those taking the oath were rewarded with indulgences. Sometimes it even worked.

In calling for the crusade against the Muslims, Urban referenced the Peace and Truce of God, calling upon the knights to extend their chivalry beyond their native lands in order to give protection to their Christian brothers and sisters in the Eastern Empire. In a manner that may seem problematic today, in order to keep that peace within Christendom, the knights were called by the Pope to send forces to combat the Muslims, and particularly to restore the lands of ancient Christianity to Christian rule.

Nor was Urban the first pope to initiate a similar call to action. During the previous four centuries several popes had committed troops and money to combating invasions of Muslims, both Arab and Turk, in Constantinople, Alexandria, and throughout Europe. Thirty years earlier, Pope Alexander II had awarded indulgences to Christians who died in battle against the Muslims in the Iberian Peninsula. Appeals for military support from the east had been made to Gregory VII as well, but he was conflicted on the concept of a "holy war" and the shedding of blood in the name of Christ. After much thought and study, he decided that under some circumstances a justified holy war could take place to protect the lives of Christians, based on his reading of St. Augustine's *City of God*, coupled with the ongoing persecutions of Christians on pilgrimage to the holy sites. However because of his estrangement from Henry IV he had no access to imperial troops, or any military who supported the emperor, so a crusade never materialized during his papacy.

But Urban's crusade was a much more elaborate undertaking. A crusader took a solemn oath of loyalty to the pope in church, was presented with a cross by the pope, or his delegate, and was known as a Soldier of the Church. There was great honor in this, as well as a number of spiritual privileges and indulgences attached to it. Knights on pilgrimage were even given authority to hear the confessions of other knights and give absolution in the name of the church, should no priest be available. To die in battle during a crusade, earned the knight complete remission of sin and a plenary indulgence. On the less spiritual side, it also provided these warriors whose activities had been curtailed by the Peace and Truce of God, an outlet for their battlefield instincts.

By the eleventh century, the populace held a great interest in religious matters due to the investiture controversy, discussion of which had filtered down to even the most uneducated people. This resulted in a period of intense Christian piety and involvement in church affairs. Therefore, when the Crusade to free the Holy Land from the hands of unbelievers was promulgated and preached, men were eager and ready to participate. Perhaps too eager – thousands of knights, squires, and grooms volunteered to be Crusaders and to regain the homeland of Jesus for the Church.

And, so, the history of the Church continues . . .

Contempladores de Estrellas



Hace alrededor de mil años un escultor en Autun, Francia trabajaba en obras para la nueva catedral de la ciudad. Una de sus esculturas muestra una escena encantadora. Los tres reyes magos con sus coronas puestas y dormidos en una misma cama son despertados por un ángel que les señala una estrella. El dedo del ángel toca suavemente la mano de uno de los reyes que está sobre una capa de tela lujosa. Los ojos de este rey se han abierto sorpresivamente, mientras que los otros dos reyes magos aparecen soñolientos. Este escultor combinó artísticamente dos historias bíblicas en una. La estrella nos recuerda a aquella que le indicó a los reyes magos el camino hacia Belén, mientras que el ángel alegoriza la advertencia que recibieron en un sueño de que no regresaran a ver a Herodes después de visitar al Niño Jesús. Durante siglos la tradición ha mantenido que los nombres de los reyes magos eran Gaspar, Melchor y Baltasar, pero en realidad nadie lo sabe por seguro. Otras tradiciones les llaman los magos de oriente, que estudiaban las estrellas. Ellos fueron los primeros no judíos que reconocieron y adoraron al Hijo de Dios, y le ofrecieron los regalos que se le ofrecen a un rey. En la Edad Media las casas se bendecían el día de la Epifanía, reflexionando en cómo los reyes magos encontraron a Cristo cuando “entraron en la casa”. Trata de revivir hoy esta antigua tradición. Se puede hacer dentro de cualquier grupo familiar. Una persona incensa la casa mientras otra rocía agua bendita y la tercera escribe con una tiza sobre cada una de las puertas exteriores la siguiente inscripción: “20 + G + M + B + 11” (o cualquiera que sea el año), lo cual significa “los tres reyes magos, Gaspar, Melchor y Baltasar en el año del Señor 2011”. El bendecir las puertas expresa y simboliza el compromiso de la familia durante ese año para recibir a todos en su hogar como si fueran el mismo Cristo.

Free Disaster Preparedness Training

The Orange Police Department, in collaboration with the Orange Fire Department, is offering both daytime and evening Community

Emergency Response Team (CERT) courses in 2017. The CERT training provides skills to residents and businesses to help themselves and their neighbors following a disaster when police and fire may be impacted.

The classroom training and hands on drills teaches disaster preparedness, fire safety, light search and rescue, terrorism response, team organization, disaster psychology, and disaster medical operations.
