Do Not Fear

You may not know of Stanley Francis Rother unless you happen to live in Oklahoma. Born there to a farming family in 1935,

young Stan recognized a calling to the priesthood in his teens. After five years in the seminary he was told he was not studious enough to continue. Fortunately, his bishop believed the best priests were not always the most intellectual, but the most committed. He enrolled the young man at Mount Saint Mary's Seminary in Maryland. Stanley studied diligently and was ordained in 1963. After five years in parish work in Oklahoma, Father Rother volunteered for the Oklahoma diocesan mission among the Tzutuhil, a Mayan people of the western Guatemala highlands. Father Rother, a strong, hard-working man, ministered to the ordinary spiritual needs of the people while learning the Tzutuhil language and translating scriptures and Mass prayers into Tzutuhil. He helped the people learn to read and write, while a mission radio station transmitted daily language and math lessons. He built a small hospital and worked on plans to improve roads. Guatemalan political power was in the hands of right-wing elites, who also controlled the military. They blamed the Church for "civil unrest" and supporting the rights of the poor. Father Rother was urged to leave and went to Oklahoma for a short visit, but he insisted on returning even though he was a marked man. In 1981 the mission radio station was smashed and its director killed. Catechists and parishioners were beaten, tortured, and killed. Father Rother stayed because he believed Jesus' words, "Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul" (Matthew 10:28). He was shot by a death squad in the night. His body was returned to Oklahoma, but at the request of the Tzutuhil people, his heart was returned to be buried where he served and died.

Dear Friends in Christ,

A Challenging Situation

I have had the difficult task over the last several months of finding ways to reduce our overall expenses in order to provide a healthy budget for the coming fiscal year. It's not my purpose to critique past financial practices, and I hope no one takes this as a reproach. Rather, my purpose is to provide what I consider to be a solid, fiscally conservative approach that will allow us to move forward confident that we can fulfill our obligations, past and present. My non-negotiables are that we operate within our Sunday income, carry no debt and set funds aside for major repairs. Proceeds from fundraisers and campaigns, such as PSA or St. Norbertfest, need to be set aside for major projects rather than funneled into the general operating fund. I am not implying by that last statement that such practices were actually occurring, but rather explaining that we really cannot use extraordinary income to cover shortfall, as some have suggested.

In order to accomplish that, we need to reduce our administrative costs. Up until recently, we have had as many as 38 people on the payroll, not counting the school, which is a very high number for any parish. Admittedly, many of these are part time, but they add up. To ensure a fiscally sound budget, we must reduce that number, consolidate roles, reassign tasks and cultivate more volunteerism. We have had to lay off some very wonderful people who have graced the parish with their wisdom, expertise and vision, and their contributions will be sorely missed. I ask for your prayers and patience as we reorganize our staff operations to meet these challenges.

Some office hours will change as well, starting on weekends. Effective July 1, the Ministry Center office hours of operation on Saturdays will be from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., and on Sundays from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. At some point, we'll need to look at our weekday schedule as well. Additionally, our staff leaders will work directly with our business manager to find as much savings as possible in each of their respective departments for future budgets.

Ministerio Hispano

No Tengen Miedo

Lo más probable es que no hayas oído hablar de Stanley Francis Rother a no ser que vivas en Oklahoma. Nació en ese estado en el año 1935 en el seno de una familia agrícola, y desde sus años de adolescencia, el joven Stan sintió un llamado al sacerdocio. Después de pasar cinco años en el seminario le dijeron que no era lo suficientemente estudioso para poder continuar. Afortunadamente, su obispo creía que los mejores sacerdotes no eran siempre los más intelectuales sino los más comprometidos. Matriculó, pues, al joven en el seminario de Saint Mary en Maryland y Stan fue ordenado sacerdote en el año 1963. Después de cinco años de trabajo parroquial en Oklahoma el padre Rother se ofreció para trabajar en la misión de la diócesis de Oklahoma entre los Tzutuhil, un pueblo maya de la región del oeste montañoso de Guatemala. El padre Rother era un hombre fuerte y no le temía al trabajo duro; él atendía las necesidades espirituales de la gente mientras aprendía el idioma Tzutuhil, y traducía las Escrituras y las oraciones de la Misa al Tzutuhil. Ayudaba a la gente para que aprendieran a leer y a escribir al mismo tiempo que tenía una misión de radio que transmitía diariamente lecciones de lenguaje y matemáticas. Construyó un hospital pequeño y colaboró en planes para mejorar los caminos públicos. El poder político guatemalteco estaba en manos de los derechistas que también controlaban a los militares. Ellos culpaban a la Iglesia por los “disturbios civiles” y por defender los derechos de los pobres. Por eso muchas personas le insistían al padre Rother que saliera de allí. Él se fue a Oklahoma, pero sólo por un período breve e insistió en regresar a pesar de ser considerado como una persona marcada. En 1981 destruyeron la misión de la radio y mataron al director. Catequistas y parroquianos fueron golpeados, torturados y asesinados. El padre Rother se quedó porque creía en las palabras de Jesús: “No teman a los que sólo pueden matar el cuerpo, pero no el alma” (Mateo 10:28). Un escuadrón de la muerte lo asesinó una noche. Su cuerpo fue llevado a Oklahoma, pero el pueblo de Tzutuhil pidió que le devolvieran el corazón del padre Rother y allí lo enterraron en la tierra donde él había servido y donde había muerto.

Una situación desafiante

Estimados amigos en Cristo,

Durante los últimos meses he tenido la difícil tarea de encontrar formas de reducir nuestros gastos generales con el fin de proporcionar un presupuesto saludable para el próximo año fiscal. No es mi intención criticar prácticas financieras pasadas, y espero que nadie tome esto como un reproche. Más bien, mi propósito es proporcionar lo que considero un enfoque sólido, fiscalmente conservador, que nos permita avanzar confiando en que podemos cumplir con nuestras obligaciones, pasadas y presentes.

Mis no negociables son que operemos dentro de nuestros ingresos dominicales, no tener deuda y reservar fondos para reparaciones mayores. Los ingresos provenientes de recaudaciones de fondos y campañas, como la PSA o St. Norbertfest, deben reservarse para proyectos importantes en lugar de canalizarse al fondo general de operaciones. No estoy insinuando en esa última afirmación que tales prácticas estuvieran realmente ocurriendo, sino explicando que no podemos usar ingresos extraordinarios para cubrir el déficit, como algunos han sugerido.

Para lograrlo, necesitamos reducir nuestros costos administrativos. Hasta hace poco, contamos con 38 personas en nómina, sin contar la escuela, que es un número muy alto para cualquier parroquia. Es cierto que muchos de estos están a tiempo parcial, pero se suman. Para asegurar un presupuesto fiscal sano, debemos reducir ese número, consolidar trabajos, reasignar tareas y cultivar más voluntariado. Hemos tenido que despedir a algunas personas maravillosas que han honrado a la parroquia con su sabiduría, experiencia y visión, y echaremos mucho de menos sus contribuciones. Pido sus oraciones y paciencia mientras reorganizamos las operaciones de nuestro personal para enfrentar estos desafíos.

Algunas horas de oficina también cambiarán, empezando los fines de semana. A partir del 1 de julio, las horas de oficina del Centro de Ministerios serán: los sábados de 9 a.m. a 4:30 p.m., y los domingos de 8 a.m. a 2 p.m. En algún momento, también tendremos que echar un vistazo a nuestro horario durante la semana. Además, nuestros líderes del personal parroquial trabajarán directamente con nuestro gerente de negocios para encontrar el mayor ahorro posible en cada uno de sus respectivos departamentos para futuros presupuestos.
