

Fourth Graders, keep your math skills sharp!



Our third graders have been busy all year learning new math skills. Mastery of all these skills is extremely important in order to develop a solid math foundation. Research shows that in order for skills to be permanently mastered, they must be continually practiced. In order to prevent the summertime “skill slump”, students are going to use the IXL math program. This site allows students to continue to practice their math skills with feedback and instructional guidelines.

As part of your child’s summer math practice, it is expected that they complete at least 30 minutes of IXL work per week over the course of the summer. Students should work until they achieve an 80 on each skill before moving on to the next one. I will be monitoring their usage over the summer and check their completion at the start of the school year.
