Dear Friends in Christ,

God is letting us know He is working powerfully in our community. Here is a short story of one way He is making His presence known.

On Tuesday St. Ann's hosted both a novena for the Knights of Columbus and the beginning of the parish-wide Marian Consecration. The novena for the Knights involved asking for the intercession of Fr. Michael McGivney, founder of the Knights of Columbus. Unexpectedly, a Knights of Columbus member obtained a first class relic of Fr. McGivney for the novena and brought it to church so that it could be venerated during the novena. Unfortunately the relic was not in a reliquary or stand that relics are kept in. This meant that there was no way it could be venerated.

A woman came to church for the Marian Consecration on Tuesday night and brought with her a relic of another saint. She brought the relic in a reliquary and when we spoke of it, I asked if we could borrow the reliquary for the novena. We tried Fr. McGivney's relic in the reliquary and it fit! Because of this we were able to venerate Fr. McGivney's relic as part of the novena. The woman who brought the relic explained that she had only brought the relic to church at the last minute, sensing that she should bring it.

What does this story tell us about God? It tells us that He is working quietly in our lives and in the life of the parish to bring things together. We are not even aware that He is doing it but He is. This quiet working shows us that He cares for us and has a plan for us that is unfolding.

As we begin our parish-wide consecration to Mary, let us trust in God's care for us and our community. God's graces are being poured out on us to prepare us for even greater graces. Let us pray for open hearts to receive the graces God wants to give us.

Thanksgiving Raffle & Bake Sale

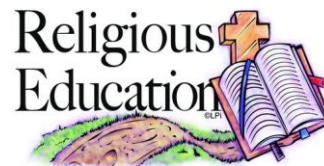
