

Increased Offertory Results

Our results from the *Parish on a Journey Program* were encouraging. Almost 47% of the parishioners who gave to the Sunday offertory in the last year made a commitment for the next year. We also had 6 families newly identify themselves as active supporters of our church.

PREPARING FOR NEXT WEEK'S LITURGY

14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Zechariah 9:9-10

In the last centuries before Christ, the Jewish people hoped for a triumphant Messiah king. The prophet Zechariah spoke instead of a Messiah who would come not in splendor and glory with horses and chariots, but rather in meekness and peace, riding a common work animal. All four evangelists will later apply this passage to the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem several days before his arrest.

Second Reading: Romans 5:12-15

Paul wants us to remember that the Spirit who will raise our bodies on the last day is the same Spirit who inspires us to holiness every day. Today Paul offers a sharp contrast between life in the flesh (meaning life prone to sin) and life in the Spirit.


