***Blast From the Past(or)***  
**Sixth Sunday of Easter**  
**May 26, 2019**

Memorial Day Weekend is rightly robust with historical reflection (and Bar-B-Que!). We proffer proper honor to all of those men and women who have fought and died to preserve the singular purpose on which our Great Nation is founded, namely, life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. What a blessing it is to be a part of this project called the United States of America. When her purpose encounters challenges, the rule of law enshrined and handed down from the Constitution guides resolution. In a more ancient practice, the Catholic Church resolves her doctrinal disputes in the form of Synods and Councils. In our first reading from Acts, we hear about such a gathering in first century Jerusalem. A dispute in the Church? Gee, that never happens. One can almost imagine the early Church deciding on a venue for her first Council. Bids went out- the Jerusalem Convention Center was chosen- not just because of its location in the recently revitalized inner harbor district, but also because it offered a good corporate group rate, free WiFi *and* HBO. Also, the much-anticipated, onsite Cheesecake Factory had finally opened and offered dessert vouchers to Council attendees. Ok, I am so sorry. I've clearly not had my coffee yet. Anyway, with all those important logistics settled, the Church got down to the work of safeguarding her Essentials. At issue was whether Gentiles coming to Christ were required to observe Jewish law. Here we see that from her very inception, the Church looked to the Apostles to articulate her teaching. It's good to know that robust argument and debate have been a part of Church from the beginning, while recognizing that revealed Faith is not a matter of straw polls, cultural trends or even 'popularity.' Sometimes the Faith of the Church and the fate of a Nation are preserved at great cost. Debate will occur in the Church as it does in our Country. But this is not the ultimate purpose of either. Instead each has a mission. How many of us are Catholic today due to the residual effects of first century Jerusalem? At the teaching of the Apostles, may we keep the Faith and therefore change the world.

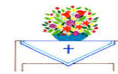
