

## Opelousas Catholic Summer Reading Enrichment 2020

Students in grades 2-9 must read one book over the summer (see chart below). There will be no other work to complete in conjunction with these books during the summer for grades 2-9. However, students will be tested and/or complete an assignment on the book in August. **All students (grades 2-12) must have a hard copy book to use in class.** The text will also be used as a platform for the initial instruction of the 2020-2021 school year and diagnostic essays the first week of school. Books are available through Amazon.com and at major bookstores such as Books-A-Million and Barnes & Noble, as well as independent book stores such as And Books Too in Lafayette.
