My Dear Parishioners,

In our celebration of the Lord's Day we mark the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Responsorial Psalm which we sing today is, "In you, Lord, I have found my peace." This verse has a special meaning for us during this month of November which is dedicated to ALL SOULS, the faithful departed. In our Catholic tradition this is a special time for us to remember all those who have gone before us with the mark of faith and sleep in peace. We are reminded of the importance of remembering the faithful departed in our prayers and especially offering the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass for their intention. We believe that the power of the Holy Mass, offered for the departed, assists them on their way to union with God. Offering the Holy Mass for the departed is not only a sign of faith but also one of love. Many people hold to the notion that when someone dies they go immediately to heaven. Indeed the saints pass quickly into the joy of heaven but for the rest of us there is that time of purification from sins so that we might enter into the holy place where the Lord God lives in all His glory. This is the place where sin does not exist nor do sinners. Those purified from their sins are made worthy to wear the proper "wedding garment" which allows them entrance into the banquet of eternal life. I suspect that the popular belief that all go to heaven immediately when they die comes from the notion that none of us are sinners. We readily absolve ourselves and refuse to acknowledge that we are in need of God's forgiveness for the many times during the day when we offend Him because of our pride. In today's Gospel the Lord Jesus tells us, "Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted."

At the side altar of the Blessed Virgin Mary, I have placed Mass offering envelopes so that the faithful departed may be remembered at the Masses which will be celebrated in our church during the month. A receptacle is also placed there in which the envelopes may be deposited. The Mass envelopes will be positioned on the altar during the month so that we will remember them in our prayers. Also at the side altar are the names of all those who passed on to eternal life since last November along with a vigil light in their memory. The "book of the dead" is also present should you like to place the names of the departed.

During this month I encourage you to visit St. Cecilia Cemetery to pray for the faithful departed. Your prayers are what they need to reach their final destiny, life on high with Christ Jesus our Lord! Your pious example should be passed on to your children so that one day someone will pray for you and not forget you!

ETERNAL REST GRANT UNTO THEM, O LORD AND MAY PERPETUAL LIGHT SHINE UPON THEM. MAY THEY REST IN PEACE.
