A Message from the Pastor

*Third Sunday in Ordinary Time
January 24, 2016*

Dear parishioners,

The cold snap (and snow? – *this is being written during predictions for an “historic blizzard”*) we are experiencing makes the very mild Christmas seem like a distant memory for me already. And now our thoughts are turning toward ... LENT? Did you know that Easter will be early this year? It will be on Sunday, March 27th. And that means that Ash Wednesday is coming up soon: February 10th! Please watch your mailbox in the coming weeks for our parish Lenten mailing. I'd like to highlight at this time a few things you will see more about in that mailing and in the weekly bulletin.

- The first is the biannual Women's Cornerstone experience. Did you know that a group of parish women have been meeting since autumn to plan this year's retreat? They have been sharing faith and planning an amazing experience! I invite all the women of the parish to mark your calendars now – please HOLD March 11-12 for the Cornerstone retreat. You won't want to miss this chance to meet other parish women and share your journey!
- At the end of that weekend we will hold our annual Parish Breakfast. Mark your calendars now for that, also! Following the 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday March 13th the Youth Ministry sponsors this annual parish social and fund raiser that is a great (and delicious!) time for everyone! - A new Lenten event is to be offered in Allendale and I'm pleased to say we will be part of it! In 2009, I submitted a request to be re-appointed for a second six-year term and Archbishop Myers granted that request also.

Center For Food Action

The Center for Food Action in Mahwah provides 85 families each week a month’s worth of groceries, thus serving approximately 340 families on a monthly basis. The Center has identified **Boxes of Instant Mashed Potatoes and Cans of White Potatoes as needed items for the month of January.** This month our goal is to collect 85 boxes of instant mashed potatoes and 85 cans of Potatoes each week to support the number of families the CFA serves on a weekly basis. For the week ending January 17, 36 boxes of instant mashed potatoes and 52 cans of white potatoes were included in the CFA donations. **If each parish family donates at least one Box of Instant Mashed Potatoes and one Can of White Potatoes on a weekly basis throughout January, we can meet our goal.** Donations can be dropped off at the Food Pantry in the back of the Church. YOUTH MINISTRY

Mini Family Bible Study

Reading: 1 Samuel 15: 19-23

Read through the complete passage to start then go through the verses asking questions such as:

v. 19-21: “[Samuel said to Saul] Why then have you disobeyed the LORD? You have pounced on the spoil, thus displeasing the LORD.” Saul answered Samuel: “I did indeed obey the LORD and fulfill the mission on which the LORD sent me. I have brought back Agag, and I have destroyed Amalek under the ban. But from the spoil the men took sheep and oxen, the best of what had been banned, to sacrifice to the LORD their God in Gilgal”

Questions: What is Samuel saying is wrong with Saul’s actions? Why does Saul believe that he has completely followed the Lord’s will? Samuel is a prophet and Saul is a King, what kind of relationship would they have had during the time of Ancient Judaism? Have there been times when felt like you were completely following God but someone with authority told you different? How did you react? How can we grow in humility to better receive advice and redirection when it comes from good spiritual counsel?

v. 22-23: “But Samuel said: “Does the LORD so delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices as in obedience to the command of the LORD? Obedience is better than sacrifice, and submission than the fat of rams. For a sin like divination is rebellion, and presumption is the crime of idolatry. Because you have rejected the command of the LORD, he, too, has rejected you as ruler.”

Questions: What do we learn about God from this passage? Why does God desire our obedience more than anything else? What usually comes from obeying the Lord? What usually comes from disobeying the Lord by breaking His commandments or going against His will? What specific things cause us to disobey the Lord; pride, indifference, purposeful ignorance, etc.? How can we grow in strength and perseverance in following the promises of the Lord rather than giving into empty lies of temptation? How can we counsel others to help them do the same?

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Religious Ed registration for the 2016 - 2017 school year is ongoing in the rectory during the regular Religious Ed office hours of Monday to Thursday 10:30 AM to 3:00 PM. On Tuesdays during January, we will be in the rectory from 7:30 PM until 9:00 PM for those who cannot make it during the day. All families are encouraged to register at this time. If you would like your family to participate in Summer Angel Wings, you must register by Tuesday February 23rd.

As of now the dates for Summer Angel Wings are June 24, 27, 28, 29, 30, July 1, 6, 7 & 8, 2016. The hours are 9:00 AM to 12:30 PM. Summer Angel Wings is open to all children who will be in grades 1 – 5 in September 2016.

The fee for all programs is:

\$175 for one child, \$225 for two children and \$275 for three or more children.

Additional fees are:

Angel Wings Art Fee: \$10, First Eucharist Fee: \$50, Eighth Grade Fee: \$50, Confirmation Fee: \$175.

Sunday February 7th the 8th graders will participate in a retreat morning. The retreat will begin at 8:45 AM in the auditorium and conclude with 11:30 Youth Mass in the church. A light breakfast will be served. Parents of 8th grade parents will meet in the barn from 8:45 until 9:30 for a meeting to go over the Confirmation program which begins in September of 9th grade with a weekend retreat on the weekend of September 16th to 18th.

Every year the Archdiocese of Newark asks that all fifth and eighth grade Religious Education Programs participate in the Assessment of Catechesis/Religious Education (ACRE). This program assessment for catechesis/religious education has been developed by the National Catholic Education Association to:

- Serve as a tool for assessing the effectiveness of catechetical/religious education programs;
- Offer a picture of where grade 5 & 8 students are in terms of their basic religious knowledge;
- Assess the religious beliefs, attitudes, practices, and perceptions of students in these grades in addition to their religious knowledge; and,
- Provide information about areas of strengths in catechetical/religious education programs as well as areas that may need additional attention or improvement.

This assessment will be administered to your fifth and eighth graders on Tuesday February 9, 2016. **Fifth grade students will take the assessment from 3:30 until 4:30 on February 9th in the barn. The eighth graders are asked to report to the auditorium from 7:30 until 8:30 PM for the administration of this assessment.** Please make sure that your children understand that this is not for a grade, but rather to see how well Guardian Angel is teaching Religious Education. We have done our best to see that the children are not stressed over this. Please do your best to have your child at Religious Education class promptly on February 9th so that we may begin the assessment on time and complete it in the limited time that we have.

Birth Parents Must Take Action to Preserve Their Privacy

For well over a century, the Catholic Church in New Jersey has provided adoption services. Throughout all those years, the Church promised to honor the privacy of birth parents and adoptees. That promise of privacy also was assured by law and affirmed by the State Superior Court. Those promises can no longer be kept. On May 27, 2014, a new law took effect that will allow adoptees and certain relatives to request and obtain the names of their biological parents beginning **January 1, 2017**.

Any birth parents who wish to preserve their privacy must submit a **Redaction Request Form** to the New Jersey Department of Health no later than **December 31, 2016**. By filing this form, birth parents will be able to keep their names off any documents provided by the State to adoptees or anyone else. The State made the **Redaction Request Form** public on August 3, 2015. The form can be downloaded at <http://nj.gov/health/forms/reg-36c.pdf>

If you know a person who placed a child in adoption, please tell them that if they do not file a **Redaction Request Form**, their name and other information could be given to the adoptee. Anyone needing assistance can call a HELPLINE AT **609-989-4809**.

Jubilee Year of Mercy January 24, 2016

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

When he announced this Jubilee Year of Mercy, Pope Francis highlighted today's Gospel episode, in which Jesus proclaims in his hometown synagogue his Spirit-anointed mission to fulfill the promises of the prophet Isaiah. Pope Francis challenges us to translate Jesus' mission to contemporary needs: to console by word and deed those materially or spiritually poor, to liberate those bound by modern society's new forms of slavery, to open the eyes of those blinded by their own self-interest, and to restore human dignity to all those from whom it has been stolen. To act with mercy in a spirit of joy!
