A Message from the Pastor

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Dear parishioners,

On Saturday, Archbishop John J. Myers ordained 10 new priests for service in the Newark Archdiocese. I have had the pleasure of teaching a homiletic class for several of these men during their year as transitional deacons, and know they will offer great, faith-filled, zealous service to God's people.



Among those newly ordained is **Father Daniel Peterson**, who brings our parish the great blessing and honor of being the site of his *first Mass as a new priest*, this weekend at our 11:30 a.m. parish Mass!

As a seminarian, Danny made Guardian Angel his home parish during his years at Immaculate Conception Seminary. He was first sent to us for a summer assignment and then later for a year-long field education assignment. In addition he has frequently returned at our invitation to lead and assist with religious education events and special liturgical celebrations. He has been a frequent visitor to the parish (and to the Celery Farm and Allendale's many fine dining establishments!) and we are joyful as he answers God's call to be a priest.

Father Daniel Peterson now begins a new life as one of the Lord's priests, and we are grateful for his vocation, his service and his friendship. We offer a special word of welcome to his parents, his family and the friends visiting our parish today for this festive occasion.

Next Saturday, June 4th, Archbishop Myers will ordain 22 men to the permanent diaconate of the Newark Archdiocese at Sacred Heart Cathedral Basilica. I have also had the pleasure of teaching a homiletics course for several of these men. They will be a great gift to the Church.

Among those to be ordained is our very own **Rey Escalon!** We look forward to his ordination and expanded ministerial service here in our parish! Rey has already begun one new project for us – serving as the chairperson for “Be My Witness,” a new program to rejuvenate parish life (watch the bulletin for more information about it!). His ordination is also open to the public, and he will serve as a deacon and preach for the first time at a parish Mass here on Sunday June 5th at our 11:30 a.m. Mass. All are welcome!

GIVE THEM SOME FOOD YOURSELVES

The Gospel for this feast reminds me of what my aunt used to tell us when we would visit her and share a meal. Her favorite saying was, "If you don't get enough to eat, it's your own fault." Perhaps Jesus would say the same as he feeds us with his Body and Blood. Some say that the multiplication of loaves was not done by breaking the laws of physics. Instead, they say that Jesus, when he began to share the little bread that he had, touched the hearts of all those who had brought food with them. They followed his example by sharing their food also--so much that there were twelve baskets left over.



Jesus came to change people's hearts, to show them God's love and how to love one another. The miracle of changing bread and wine into his Body and Blood is not just so we can feel good about having Jesus so near to us. It is meant to strengthen us to do our best as his disciples. As food and drink help us to keep on working, his Body and Blood help us to keep on loving.

When the disciples told Jesus about the hungry crowd, he told them, "Give them some food yourselves" (Luke 9:13). And one day they would. When they celebrated the Eucharist after Jesus' resurrection, they gave that spiritual food to the new followers of Christ. We continue that today. With Jesus' strength we can teach all people about the Father's love for them and how they can love each other.
