Dear parishioners,

Many of you are aware of the church's process for welcoming adults into the Catholic faith – the Rites of Christian Initiation of Adults. It is an ongoing ministry of the Church – we are always ready to welcome people who are inquiring about the faith, and interested in proceeding with entering the faith. For some time now, members of our RCIA team have been meeting with an "inquirer." And so at the 5:30 P.M. Mass next weekend, January 28th, I will celebrate the RCIA "Rite of Welcoming" for Alexandra Acaster, our adult candidate, who seeks to be received into the Catholic Church, receive Eucharist and be Confirmed.

Allie already shares our Catholic faith through Baptism. We mark this moment of her following God's continuing call to live her Catholic faith as she journeys toward completion of the Sacraments of Initiation with the reception of the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation sometime during the Easter Season this year.

You, the people of the Catholic Church, the people of Guardian Angel parish, are very important in this rite, for it is the whole parish community – not just her sponsor, Regina Guarnaccia, and the RCIA team - that welcomes, shares our Christian faith, and walks the faith journey together in the days and years ahead. Please welcome Allie into this process and keep her in your prayers.

A NEW DAWN

Darkness is a very common human experience. Have you recently been in pitch darkness? When it is really dark, not only can't you see where to take the next steps, you can't see any activity around you, whether good or bad. This is the kind of darkness Isaiah speaks of in our reading. In this darkness, the people of Israel, and all humanity, can't see how God is working on their behalf. So when Jesus arrives on the scene in our Gospel passage, it is like the first rays of sunlight from the dawn, giving clarity and hope. In Jesus we can begin to see how God is active on behalf of all people, and in fact has been working during the earlier darkness. We can begin to see where to take our next steps, and to learn how to reflect this light to others.

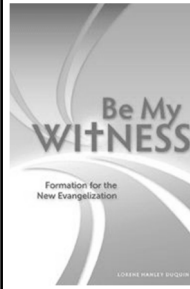
FROM THE ORDINARY

When Matthew turns to the call of the first disciples of Jesus, it is striking how ordinary these men were. Jesus does not recruit "the best and the brightest" as his core team. The four disciples named here had little or no education, no special breeding, no influence in high places. They had ordinary jobs in ordinary places. But this is often how God works, throughout the story of God and the Chosen People in the Bible. Remember the call of ordinary folks like Abraham, Moses, David, Mary, and many others. Today we are reminded that God loves us and calls us just as we are, where we are, in the present. God doesn't ask us to become somehow more acceptable ahead of time, in order to draw near to God. We are called by God to be partners and disciples, and God will teach us along the way. Wherever we are in our lives, God calls us from our ordinariness, to join our hearts with the divine Heart, and to join God in the work that must be done.

January is designated as Human Trafficking Prevention Month. Here are some facts about Human Trafficking:

- At the heart of human trafficking is the trafficker's goal of exploitation and enslavement. Therefore, human trafficking does not always mean transportation of the victim along territories. It can take place in one's own hometown.
- Sexual exploitation and forced labor are the most commonly identified forms of human trafficking.
- More than half of the victims are female.
- Other forms of exploitation include domestic servitude and forced marriage, organ removal, and the exploitation of children in begging, the sex trade and warfare.
- Along with illegal arms and drug trafficking, human trafficking is one of the largest international crime industries in the world. Human trafficking takes in \$150 billion in illegal profits per year.

If you would like your family to participate in Summer Angel Wings, you must register by Tuesday March 7th. As of now the dates for Summer Angel Wings are June 22, 23, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, July 6 & 7, 2017. The hours are 9:00 AM to 12:30 PM. Summer Angel Wings is open to all children who will be in grades 1 – 5 in September 2017.

On Sunday February 5th the 8th graders will participate in a retreat morning. The retreat will begin at 8:30 AM in the auditorium and conclude with 11:30 Youth Mass in the church. A light breakfast will be served. Parents of 8th grade parents will meet in the barn from 8:30 until 9:30 for a meeting to go over the Confirmation program which begins in September of 9th grade with a weekend retreat in September.

Every year the Archdiocese of Newark asks that all fifth and eighth grade Religious Education Programs participate in the Assessment of Catechesis/Religious Education (ACRE). This program assessment for catechesis/religious education has been developed by the National Catholic Education Association to:

- Serve as a tool for assessing the effectiveness of catechetical/religious education programs;
- Offer a picture of where grade 5 & 8 students are in terms of their basic religious knowledge;
- Assess the religious beliefs, attitudes, practices, and perceptions of students in these grades in addition to their religious knowledge; and,
- Provide information about areas of strengths in catechetical/religious education programs as well as areas that may need additional attention or improvement.

This assessment will be administered to your fifth and eighth graders on Tuesday February 14, 2017. **Fifth grade students will take the assessment from 3:30 until 4:30 on February 9th in the barn. The eighth graders are asked to report to the barn from 7:30 until 8:30 PM for the administration of this assessment.**

Please make sure that your children understand that this is not for a grade, but rather to see how well Guardian Angel is teaching Religious Education. We have done our best to see that the children are not stressed over this. Please do your best to have your child at Religious Education class promptly on February 14th so that we may begin the assessment on time and complete it in the limited time that we have.
