A Message from the Pastor

January 27, 2019
Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

During the school year our parish is assisted at weekend Mass by the Salesian priests from Don Bosco High School in Ramsey. From time to time, we share with you some spiritual reflections from the Salesians.

The Dark Face of the Internet Special from Salesian News Service

Originally published November 3, 2017

(ANS - Rome) - If we wanted to find a metaphor to describe fully the revolution caused to society since the introduction and use of the Internet, we could certainly compare this phenomenon to the discovery of a new planet, a new continent, a territory continuously being explored that we cannot manage fully to fathom, one that we repeatedly marvel at, that surprises us with ever-new aspects and unexpressed potential.

By its nature, the Net is a dynamic space, constantly moving and transforming itself, consisting of networks and sub-networks; of different types and shapes that, in essence, aim to facilitate encounters between people or groups with similar interests, or the exchange of every type of content, to create spaces for play or for any variety of various and infinite needs.

The digital world is the result of an extraordinary convergence between technology and science that has radically transformed our lives and our way of communicating and relating to each other. New residents register on this planet every second, with new content and new forms of association and interconnections at multiple levels.

This territory has quickly been invaded by teenagers and young people who enter without fear or prejudice, trying to satisfy their need for company, affection, communication, meeting. Today, the Net is used worldwide by over 800 million minors. It is in relation to minors that the Internet presents its darkest side, the cause of new and serious worldwide issues: child pornography, trolling, cyberbullying, sexual blackmail or "sextortion," sexual seduction of minors, grooming or the sending of messages, texts, and sexually explicit images via mobile phones or similar means - "sexting" - not to mention the trafficking of children, especially young girls.

All these situations have spread exponentially, overcoming and going beyond the control of social institutions to cause profound damage to the social, moral and ethical fabric. A study by the European Union states that 20% of children under the age of 18 have already been victims on the Net of some form of sexual violence.

For the Church, this is a difficult topic to deal with for historical reasons; nevertheless, the Pope invites us to begin from our own communities, demanding zero tolerance, facing without fear and with decision any and all kinds of abuse against the dignity of minors; also, one must begin to talk about the problem without qualms, starting from concrete data, and seek concrete and effective forms of prevention. Above all, we must form educators and parents in the primordial nucleus of the family who know how to accompany children in the "digital courtyards."

One must abandon a partial or one-sided view, stop thinking it is a problem meant to be dealt with solely by specialized institutions. One can no longer be so naive as to rely blindly on computer algorithms or filters to keep children away from these dangers. Protecting the physical and psychological integrity of minors is a task that implies cooperation of all institutions, starting with the family and parents. The latter are increasingly

But the prophet said, Today is holy . . . do not be sad, and do not weep.

The year acceptable to the Lord is this year. The day that is holy is this day. The time to listen is now. What sort of year will you have? What sort of day? God's help is always here. What you do with each day can be holy and acceptable to the Lord if you but listen to and act on God's word.

If you would like your family to participate in Summer Angel Wings, you must register by Tuesday March 5th. As of now the dates for Summer Angel Wings are June 26, 27, 28, July 1, 2, 3, 8, 9 & 10, 2019. The hours are 9:00 AM to 12:30 PM. Summer Angel Wings is open to all children who will be in grades 1 – 5 in September 2019.

Children's Church has continued to be very popular this year and after a short break during the Christmas holidays will resume in January. This is an opportunity for young children to participate in a special liturgical experience created just for them.

- *All children in grades K – 3 are invited to participate at 11:30 Mass on Sundays.
- *The children come to Mass and sit with their families at the beginning of Mass.
- *They are then called forward and process with the adult team to the vestibule.
- *For the readings and homily, the children hear the same scripture as the older participants, but the language is on their level.
- *Usually a question and answer period follows the Gospel reading.
- *After a short closing prayer the children return to their families during the offertory to celebrate Mass together.

We hope that your children will participate in this on a regular basis. Since we understand that 11:30 Mass may not be the most convenient time for your family EVERY week, please know that participation in this program does not require a weekly commitment to this particular Mass. We are always looking for adult volunteers to help with this ministry. If this is something that might be of interest to you, please contact the Religious Ed office.

World Day for Consecrated Life

In 1997, Pope Saint John Paul II instituted a day of prayer to celebrate women and men in consecrated life. Since then the universal Church celebrates World Day for Consecrated Life on February 2nd. This celebration is attached to the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. This Feast is also known as Candlemas Day; the day on which candles are blessed symbolizing Christ who is the light of the world. Single lay people may choose to be consecrated virgins and make private vows to the local bishop. Secular institutes are another form of living the consecrated life.
