Joshua and the Israelites celebrated Passover in Jericho. This was the first time they had eaten the produce of the promised land. After this, there was no more bread sent from heaven because they were able to eat the yield of the land.

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:17-21

Paul tells us that anyone living in Jesus is a new creation because God has reconciled with us through Christ. As an ambassador for Jesus, Paul implores that the Corinthians be reconciled to God through Jesus.

Gospel: Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

When a famine broke out, he returned home and asked his father to become a hired hand. 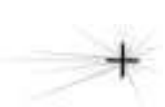
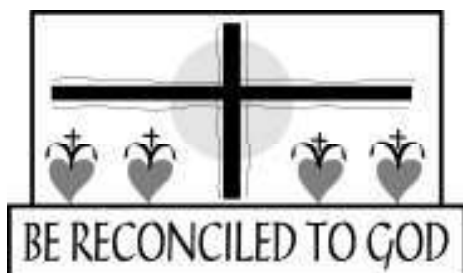

We are thrilled to announce that All Saints Academy has been named an AdvancEd STEM Certified School!!! Science – Technology – Engineering - Math

All Saints Academy is the first school in Morris County and one of only three schools in the state of New Jersey to receive this distinction. In earning this recognition, our school demonstrates its commitment to preparing students for their future educational and career paths by providing a learning environment rich in interdisciplinary studies marked by innovation, creativity, collaboration, critical thinking and problem solving skills. This achievement is the result of six years of research, development and implementation of STEM education in our school's learning community. Since our first year of operation, our teachers have worked in partnership with parents, students and stakeholders to build a community that supports and propels teaching and learning practices through the lens of faith, social responsibility and STEM citizenship. We are especially proud that this initiative has been very successful within the nurturing framework of Catholic education. The certification process began with an extensive self-assessment and self-study to discern our mastery in eleven rigorous STEM education indicators. The process involved the on-site evaluation by an expert AdvancEd review team. The visit also included interview sessions with three groups: school parents and stakeholders, students representing grades four through eight, and faculty members. The team members observed learning experiences in twelve classroom settings, preschool through grade eight. Achieving high scores across the indicators certifies that students have been equipped with and trained to be innovative, creative and systematic problem-solvers across disciplines. The team also noted a strong commitment to continuous improvement based on measurable goals and high expectations for both student and teacher performance. Part of the review included our creation and presentation of a film depicting the life of STEM in our school community.
