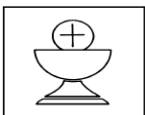
LIVESTREAMING AT NATIVITY

From the Music & Fine Arts Ministry:

WHO STARTED IT?

Western Music began with "US" – namely the Roman Catholic Church. There are "stories" such as the one monk that had been up to late transcribing by candle light and quill and ink a passage of the Holy Scriptures - who fell asleep in one of the "Hours" Prayer observances and the other monks began to sing verses of the daily psalm to conceal his snoring from the abbot. And there is also the story that Pope Gregory I – A.D. 590-604 – told everyone that "... a dove had flown down from heaven, perched on his shoulder, and dictated all the chants into his ear." Regardless of your choice – it is widely believed by Musicologists that early chants were "modes" from the Synagogue or "thaats" from the east that were incorporated over time in the earliest beginning of the church to adorn the Holy Scriptures in the Offices - Prayer Hours. Many of our symbols in worship – such as the candles on the communion table for example, come from the Shabbat Candles of the Synagogue. Because of the "oral" tradition of recording/memory of the age, many early modes – chants were lost. It would be Pope Gregory I that finally – "...charged his monks with the task of organizing the remaining early (Monophonic) chants so that they would be better preserved. Thus, Gregorian Chant was born and Western Music's first recorded music was established and preserved.
