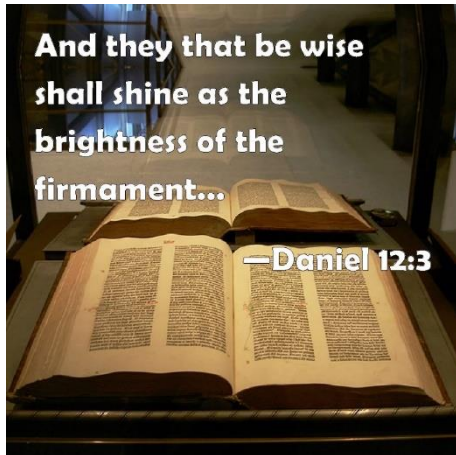

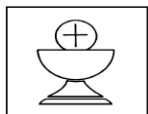
Saturday, December 4th – 3:00 p.m.- A “Service of Advent Lessons & Musical Reflections” will be offered in the Cathedral.

“FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING”: (also called: Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ – King of the Universe) Originally, it was celebrated on the last Sunday in October, but in the revised liturgical calendar promulgated by Pope Paul VI in 1969 – it was moved to the last Sunday of Ordinary Time – immediately preceding Advent. This action made the theme of Christ’s dominion more of a fitting end to the liturgical year. Our Bishop Kihneman has decreed this to be the “Year of the Eucharist” and we will celebrate with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at 10:30 am on Christ the King Sunday – November 21st-concluding with Benediction into the 11 am Mass. Plan to attend and spend time in the company of our Lord and Savior!
