#### **The Feast Of The Assumption**

August 15<sup>th</sup> is the feast of the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is one of the oldest feasts of the Church celebrated in honor of Mary. It was traditionally believed back in the 5<sup>th</sup> century that Mary's body was taken to heaven—that she did not face corruption of the body since she was preserved from Original Sin. The feast has been celebrated liturgically since 600 AD. This belief by Catholics for centuries was solemnly defined by Pope Pius XII in 1950, namely, that after Mary's death, God raised her body and she lives with God. Vatican II reemphasizes this teaching and connects the life of Mary with that of the Church.

Mary's life is one of innocence, patience, faith and love. It is good for us on this special feast of Mary to honor her with our prayers and to thank God for the gift of Mary who nurtured her child, Jesus, taught him and protected him. She was connected to him in many ways but especially in the fire of His love.

Her example to us is one of unprecedented faith, allowing her to say, "your will, not mine, be done"—allowing her to be present to God, to herself and to each person who walked through her door and into her heart. This simple faith is something that we all need. You and I are not called to heroism. We are simply called to be the best we can be—a son or daughter, wife or husband, a neighbor, a friend. The way we live—what we say or do for one another—reveals God's love and mercy for the world and enables us to come to a new beginning.

The Assumption is a feast when we celebrate the gift of life—the life given to us by God, the life of God in us, and the way to be strong disciples of Jesus by following the example of Mary, the Mother of God.

# Religious Formation Did you register your children for Religious Formation Classes yet?

- Religious Formation Registration for the new School Year will be completed online again this year.
- All families registered in the Religious Formation Program are required to be registered parishioners and supportive of the St. Pius X Parish.
- First Eucharist Preparation is a two-year program which begins in 1<sup>st</sup> grade. Any child who will be in the 1<sup>st</sup> grade is required to register *now* in order to celebrate the Sacrament of First Eucharist in the 2<sup>nd</sup> grade.
- Continued class participation is necessary in Grades 3–8 in order to register for the Confirmation Program.
- 9<sup>th</sup> grade Catholic High School students are required to register for the Confirmation Program within their Parish.
