Saint Pius X School Moving Along

STEM science projects are growing and filling the rooms. Right now the sixth graders have displayed the mythical constellations each student created. The displays and write ups were both interesting and exciting.

Sixth graders finished creating their "mythical constellations." Each student wrote a story and created their own constellation which will be displayed in the Saint Pius X sky. The seventh graders are in the process of developing their own "superhero" element.

We are continuing to learn more about the Periodic Table. And the eighth graders are researching different scientists and creating an information Facebook page for each. Also, recently the middle school students completed a STEM challenge, the shipping survival to create a package to transport and ship live flowers for 24 hours using everyday materials. All the students created different packaging devices, and "most" were successful. The children are always looking for the next challenge.

The fifth graders just completed their "Rock Cycle Stories" books. Students studied the cycle in which rocks are created and cleverly wrote fictional stories in which their rocks traveled through an adventure. So proud of them!
