Even up until the last days, I was hopeful that our school would be able to serve our parish next year. If there was any way to have our school continue, we would have done it.

We will do everything possible to have our students accepted in neighboring Catholic schools. In the same way, we'll try to assist our teachers in obtaining positions in other Catholic schools.

With our staff and volunteers, we will work even harder to continue the quality of our parish religious education program on every level. We want the spirit of St. Pius X School to always be seen in the ways that our parish community spreads the message of Jesus.


