The Feast Of The Assumption

August 15th is the feast of the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is one of the oldest feasts of the Church celebrated in honor of Mary. It was traditionally believed back in the 5th century that Mary's body was taken to heaven—that she did not face corruption of the body since she was preserved from Original Sin. The feast has been celebrated liturgically since 600 AD. This belief by Catholics for centuries was solemnly defined by Pope Pius XII in 1950, namely, that after Mary's death, God raised her body and she lives with God. Vatican II re-emphasizes this teaching and connects the life of Mary with that of the Church.

Mary's life is one of innocence, patience, faith and love. It is good for us on this special feast of Mary to honor her with our prayers and to thank God for the gift of Mary who nurtured her child, Jesus, taught him and protected him. She was connected to him in many ways but especially in the fire of His love.

Her example to us is one of unprecedented faith, allowing her to say, "your will, not mine, be done"—allowing her to be present to God, to herself and to each person who walked through her door and into her heart. This simple faith is something that we all need. You and I are not called to heroism. We are simply called to be the best we can be—a son or daughter, wife or husband, a neighbor, a friend. The way we live—what we say or do for one another—reveals God's love and mercy for the world and enables us to come to a new beginning.

The Assumption is a feast when we celebrate the gift of life—the life given to us by God, the life of God in us, and the way to be strong disciples of Jesus by following the example of Mary, the Mother of God.

Rev. Jilson Panakkal of The Diocese of Kannur, India, will be speaking at all Masses next weekend, August 18-19.

The Diocese of Kannur is in Southwest India. Established in 1999, it encompasses two civil districts with a population of 60 thousand Catholics. The present Bishop, His Excellency Most Reverend Alex Vadakumthala is the second Bishop of the Diocese. The majority of the Christian community was converted from Dalits or low caste Hindus. Our Diocesan Mission Appeal is asking for your prayerful and financial support in the following areas of development: formation of our Seminarians, faith and academic formation of our children especially in the rural sector, women empowerment programs, housing projects, rehab center called "Mercy Village" for the physically and mentally challenged and a care home facility for the abandoned children. 
BIBLE STUDY

Fatima Statue

As many of you may know, 2017 marked the 100th year anniversary of the apparitions of our Blessed Mother to 3 children in Fatima, Portugal. Spanning these 100 years, millions of pilgrims, myself and my family included, have visited this holy and inspiring site in Portugal. Just this past May, Pope Francis went there to canonize 2 of the visionaries.

Devotion spread, and consequently, an International Pilgrim Statue of Our Lady of Fatima, who is also known as Our Lady Of The Rosary, was established in 1947. This international statue continues to travel the globe and has traveled numerous times to parishes throughout the US. As an offshoot of that, many parishes also established devotion to Our Lady of Fatima, and have within their own parish community a scaled down version of the pilgrim statue that is welcomed by a family on a weekly basis.

We are beginning our second year with The St. Pius X Statue of Our Lady of Fatima. The first year was very successful and brought out a positive reaction and enthusiasm among the parishioners. The statue will be in the Church on the weekend of September 8th & 9th, when Kathi Weiner will be speaking at all the Masses. 19th Sunday Of Ordinary Time

First Reading: I Kings 19:4-8

Queen Jezebel had vowed to kill Elijah, who went into the desert and prayed for death. Instead he went to sleep and was awakened by an angel, who told him to eat the food God had given him. He ate and went back to sleep, but God's angel again woke him and told him to eat. Strengthened by the food, he got up and walked forty days and nights to the mountain of God.

Second Reading: Ephesians 4:30—5:2

Paul appeals to the Ephesians to get rid of bitterness, anger, and malice. Instead they must be kind, compassionate, and forgiving just as God has been. We must be imitators of Christ, and love one another as he has loved us.

Gospel: John 6:41-51

The Jews were not convinced that Jesus was the bread that came down from heaven. But he again explains that he is the bread of life. He tells them that anyone who believes and eats this bread shall live forever. He explains that the bread he will give is his flesh, for the life of the world.
