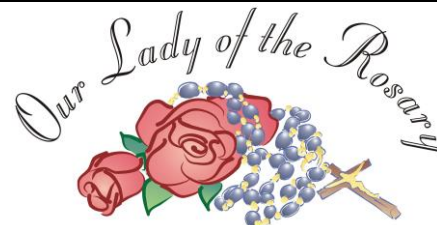

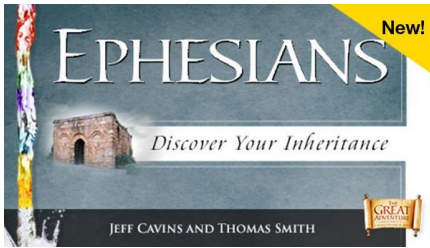
## **BIBLE STUDY**
