Lenten Regulations

The entire season of Lent from Ash Wednesday, March 6th, to before Holy Thursday, April 18th, is a penitential season, a time for self-denial, prayers and Christian charity.

1. The days of fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
2. The Fridays of Lent are Days of Abstinence.
3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat with some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance. This may be physical mortification or acts of religion, charity, or Christian witness.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are *obliged to fast*. By this obligation the individual is permitted only one full meal in the day.

From the ages of 14, all are obliged to abstain. The law of abstinence forbids eating meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind even though made from animal fat.

Organ Campaign Update

On March 7, 2019, we began our campaign to replace our organ for Christmas. It is my desire to be fully transparent with the finances in every area of our parish. The cost of the organ is approximately \$250,000 and possible upgrades depending on the generosity of St. Pius X families.

As stated before, thanks to the generosity of Lou and Christine D'Ascenza, we have seed money of \$130,000. The Polish-American Carnival fundraiser donated \$16,000. To date, 33 donors have donated \$27,100.

St. Pius X Organ Fundraiser



The pipe organ, like a congregation, is composed of many unique voices. Singing together they create harmonies that lift us to a worthy praise of God.

The Problem

It has been apparent for some time that our current electronic organ console's electronics has served our church to its' extent. The current instrument has been inoperable since June 2018. The music ministry's ability to support our liturgy relies on an instrument that can properly enliven our worship as we look toward building a better future in our Church.

The Solution

The Peragallo Organ Company of Paterson has designed a new organ to serve as a cornerstone for our music ministry, envisioning an instrument capable of fulfilling the many varied needs of liturgy throughout the year. The instrument is a hybrid combination of pipes and digital technology which combines the centuries' history of the Church with 21st technology.
