ASA Co-Sponsorship Model Expands To Include Saint Pius X Parish

Great things are happening at All Saints Academy!

We are happy to share that Saint Pius X Parish has recently joined Saint Ann Parish, Saint Christopher Parish and Saint Peter the Apostle Parish as the fourth co-sponsor of All Saints Academy. On April 12th, the Pastors of these four area parishes met with Bishop Serratelli to affirm their shared commitment to Catholic education in the Parsippany area. Father David Pickens (Saint Ann Parish), Father Joseph Buffardi (Saint Christopher Parish), Monsignor Herbert Tillyer (Saint Peter the Apostle Parish) and Father Mark Olenowski (Saint Pius X Parish) have pledged to work cooperatively to oversee and support the school's operation and to promote All Saints Academy as this area's PreSchool-Grade 8 diocesan school.

With nearly 300 students, All Saints Academy has recently celebrated its 10th Anniversary and has been a successful model of a co-sponsored elementary school. Each parish and its leadership participates in the spiritual, educational, financial and community facets of the school. This model has been uniquely successful in our Diocese and now will grow stronger with the inclusion of the Saint Pius X and Montville families.

All Saints Academy is a nationally recognized STEM school of the Diocese of Paterson. Our school offers a comprehensive, multi-curricular, rigorous academic program, centered on values-based education. A strong and loving Catholic identity permeates the environment. A spirit of faith, respect and joy are evident in our school. In addition to religious instruction, students model Christian ideals through cooperative activities, spiritual and liturgical celebrations, participation in Sacraments, and service outreach. An active parent organization lends partnership and support to the school community. The Early Childhood Center offers classes for three and four year old children. Divine Mercy Celebration **Sunday, April 28th, 3-4 pm**

(2-3 pm Confessions & Silent Eucharistic Adoration)

Our Lord said to Sister Faustina: "The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on Divine Mercy Sunday will obtain complete forgiveness of sin and punishment."

"Tell people, my daughter, that I am love and mercy itself. When a soul approaches Me with trust, I fill it with such an abundance of graces that it cannot contain them within itself but radiates them to other souls." (Jesus to St. Faustina)

Background of the Divine Mercy Devotion

From the diary of a young Polish nun, a special devotion began spreading throughout the world in the 1930's. The message is nothing new, but is a reminder of what the Church has always taught through Scripture and tradition: that God is merciful and forgiving and that we, too, must show mercy and forgiveness. But in the Divine Mercy devotion, the message takes on a powerful new focus, calling people to a deeper understanding that God's love is unlimited and available to everyone — especially the greatest sinners.

The message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of about 600 pages recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. Even before her death in 1938, the devotion to The Divine Mercy had begun to spread.

The message of mercy is that God loves us — all of us — no matter how great our sins. He wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy. It is a message we can call to mind simply by remembering ABC.

- A — Ask for His Mercy.
- B — Be merciful.
- C — Completely trust in Jesus.

This confidence leads us to a renewed Easter joy.

St. Pius X Organ Fundraiser



The pipe organ, like a congregation, is composed of many unique voices. Singing together they create harmonies that lift us to a worthy praise of God.

The Problem

It has been apparent for some time that our current electronic organ console's electronics has served our church to its' extent. The current instrument has been inoperable since June 2018. The music ministry's ability to support our liturgy relies on an instrument that can properly enliven our worship as we look toward building a better future in our Church.

The Solution

The Peragallo Organ Company of Paterson has designed a new organ to serve as a cornerstone for our music ministry, envisioning an instrument capable of fulfilling the many varied needs of liturgy throughout the year. The instrument is a hybrid combination of pipes and digital technology which combines the centuries' history of the Church with 21st technology.
