## "A GOD EXPERIENCE"

In today's gospel we hear Jesus reply to the question, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus instructs us by referring to the greatest commandment. "Love the Lord with all your heart, all your being, all your strength, all your mind and love your neighbor as yourself." Jesus then tells us the famous parable of the "Good Samaritan", where a Priest and a Levite fail to help the victim, and the hated Samaritan becomes the hero. Jesus then tells the Scholar, who originally asked, "Who is my neighbor?" to answer this question himself. The scholar is forced to admit, "Those who treated the victim with mercy." Jesus then commands "Go and do likewise". In this Holy Year of Mercy we should heed Jesus' words **because Mercy is the virtue and attribute that makes us most like God**. When we practice **Mercy** we are automatically involving kindness, forgiveness, charity, understanding, courage etc. You should jump at every chance and opportunity the good Lord gives you to show mercy. ### FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### First Reading: Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Moses petitions the people to follow the commandments God has set before them. He reminds them that the laws are not in the sky or far away at sea, but are accessible to them and meant to be followed if they wish to prosper.

#### Second Reading: Colossians 1:15-20

Paul discusses the divine nature of Jesus, and explains that Jesus was created before anything else. Everything else was "created through him, and for him."

#### Gospel: Luke 10:25-37

While discussing everlasting life, a lawyer mentions loving one's neighbor as oneself. The lawyer then asks Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus tells him about a man beaten by robbers, who was ignored by both a priest and a Levite before a Samaritan stopped and offered him aid. Jesus asks the lawyer who was neighbor to the injured man. The lawyer says "the one who treated him with compassion." Jesus encourages him to go and do the same.
