“POWER AND PURPOSE”

Throughout the Scriptures we find that when God speaks, things happen. God's words have Power and Purpose. In today's culture of despair and suffering we have in our very midst the "Power of God". The Lord has given us the very breath of life in the Holy Scriptures. How completely do you retain, practice, live and share the Hope and Joy of God's Word? Mass is the high note of your Catholic faith where you encounter Christ in His Holy Word and in the Eucharist. You are commissioned to then share His Offer of Salvation to those around you. Do you know Jesus well enough to give Him to another? You can't give what you don't have. Today's readings speak of seeds that fall on fertile ground and take root, compared to seeds that wither and die. God knows every heart, the heart that is fertile and the heart that is hard. Do you have a heart for God? Have you allowed God's words to take deep root and spring forth Holy fruit? The Word of God holds within it the Power to change your life, but you must be open to it. The Word of God has a Purpose that is a "perfect fit" to mold and shape your destiny; but will you let it? The Power and Purpose of God's words are to bring you into a "Right Relationship" with the Lord; are you willing to change? The Power and Purpose of God's words speak to you with Love and Intimacy; have you heard them? In today's 1st reading, Isaiah 55, God tells you "my word shall not return to me void, but shall do my will, achieving the end for which I sent it". In today's gospel Jesus tells you "Knowledge of the mysteries of the Kingdom of heaven has been granted to you." Are you the rich soil that produces fruit for God's kingdom? Do not return God's words of Power and Purpose to Him empty. Do you believe and trust in His Holy Word? Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal God's mysteries and love, so that you can hear God's Word with Faith and Joy; then you will bear Holy fruit. You are called to receive and sow the Word, only then will His Word achieve the end for which it was sent. **GOD HAS TRUSTED YOU WITH HIS POWER AND PURPOSE. First Reading: Isaiah 55:10-11

Just as the rain and snow water the earth and make it fruitful, so does the word of God bring forth good seed.

Second Reading: Romans 8:18-23

Reminding all that the trials and sufferings of this life are "as nothing," Paul says that the glory we shall receive will overshadow all things.

Gospel: Matthew 13:1-23

Jesus tells the parable of the sower and the seed. The seed that landed on the footpath, on rocky ground, or among thorns withered and died; the seed that fell on good ground -- "the man who hears the message and takes it in" ... "bears a yield of a hundred-fold."

CHRIS LOWNEY TO SPEAK AT ST. MARY'S DENVER

Please reserve September 18, 7pm at St. Mary's Church, Denver! Sponsored by Assumption College for Sisters, Chris Lowney will speak on the topic of leadership, featuring his latest work, *Everyone Leads: How to Revitalize the Catholic Church*.

Chris Lowney chairs the board of Catholic Health Initiatives, one of the nation's largest healthcare/hospital systems. He has lectured in more than two-dozen countries on leadership, business ethics, and other related topics. He is the author of five books, including the bestselling *Heroic Leadership* and *Pope Francis: Why He Leads the Way He Leads*, which was called "a book for the ages" and became the # 1 bestseller on Amazon's "Popes and the Vatican" list. Chris's most recent work is, "Everyone Leads: How to Revitalize the Catholic Church." During his talk, Chris will explore some of the profound challenges now facing the Church and will invite each of us to step up and help lead the Church's revitalization. Chris also founded and speaks on behalf of Pilgrimage for Our Children's Future, which funds education and healthcare projects in the developing world. He is a one-time Jesuit seminarian, and a summa cum laude graduate of Fordham University, where he also received his M.A. He is holder of five honorary Doctoral degrees. There is no admission; however, a free will offering can be made for Lowney's foundation, **Pilgrimage for Our Children's Future**.
