“THE BETTER PART”

Our readings for today present us with much to ponder. In our first reading, we find Abraham entertaining three mysterious strangers. After dinner and at the conclusion of the visit, they foretell and promise Abraham that by the same time next year, Sarah, his wife, will give birth to a son in spite of her advanced age. God's promise is fulfilled with the birth of Isaac, one year later. Abraham, it seems, has been chosen by God to become the Patriarch of the three major religions - Judaism, Islam and Christianity. What did Abraham do that was so special in the eyes of God? Was it because his life was focused on his relationship with God? Was it because he was always willing to serve others without complaining or when God said go, he went. Could it be his obedience, for when he was asked to sacrifice, he did, regardless of the cost? Is this why he was chosen and blessed? Fast forward now to today's gospel concerning the sisters, Martha and Mary. Martha is distracted and complains to Jesus about all her work while Mary sits at the Lord's feet, listening to His words. Jesus answers Martha complaint with "you worry and fret about so many things, only one thing is needed and Mary has chosen the better part." What part do you choose in your life? Do you busy yourself with your own plans? Are you willing to adjust your schedule in order to spend time adoring the Lord, making a Holy Hour, saying a daily Rosary, or reading Scripture? 

SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Genesis 18:1-10a

The Lord appeared to Abraham, who saw three men standing near his tent. Sensing they were messengers, he hurriedly brought them food and water to refresh themselves. Upon leaving, the men told him that they would visit in a year, at which time his childless wife Sarah would have a son.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:24-28

Paul discusses the suffering Christ endured for his Church. He describes his willingness to also endure suffering in Jesus' name. Paul hopes that through his sacrifices, many people will become complete in Jesus.

Gospel: Luke 10:38-42

Jesus was welcomed into the home of a woman named Martha. She complained to Jesus that her sister Mary sat listening to him instead of helping with the tasks of entertaining. Jesus told Martha that her sister had chosen the more important task, and should be allowed to listen.
