As part of the Diocesan Mission Coop. Plan, a Salesian Sister of St. John Bosco will speak at OLM on Aug. 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup>, on behalf of their foreign mission ministries. They will be asking for your help in support of their works throughout the world. The Salesian Sisters are a worldwide community counting 12,545 sisters spreading the Gospel on every continent. Approx. 3,000 sisters work in mission areas affected by great poverty, disease, political unrest, violence, war and other difficult conditions such as areas of natural disaster and refugee camps. They are in 17 African countries, the poorest because of war and violence for example South Sudan. They are also in the Middle East, particularly in zones where war is destroying people and environment. In Syria they have a hospital too small for present needs but they are dedicating themselves day and night to children, young people, families who have lost their homes, the dying and the wounded. **The Sisters are grateful for the opportunity of sharing their mission work in our parish and of benefiting from your generosity.**

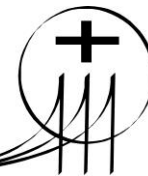

# Patience

## “ABLAZE”

Today's readings speak about a faith in God that suffers, witnesses and perseveres. In our 1<sup>st</sup> reading, Jeremiah was left to die in a cistern for his prophecy that the people of Jerusalem would suffer and be captured by Babylon due to their unfaithfulness to God. In our 2<sup>nd</sup> reading St. Paul reminds us that Jesus “endured opposition from sinners”, yet suffered & endured, as to leave His Crucifixion as a witness of God’s love for you.” Luke’s gospel sums it all up when Jesus says “I have come to set the earth on fire with a Baptism that, until it is accomplished, I am in great anguish.” Jesus knows that His death and resurrection will usher in a purifying fire that will cause separation and destruction along with renewal, leaving you the offer of Eternal Life. Will you surrender all to Jesus, pick up your cross and become His witness by following His truths? In the Christian Churches today there are confusing and conflicting teachings, yet St. Paul says “do not grow weary and lose heart; instead persevere in running the race and rid yourselves of every sin, while keeping your eyes fixed on Jesus.” **DO YOU HAVE THE COURAGE OF JEREMIAH, THE FAITH OF ST. ## TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### First Reading: Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10

Jeremiah urged the people of Jerusalem to surrender to the enemy. This angered the princes, who then requested that Jeremiah be put to death. The king allowed the princes to leave him in a cistern without food or water. But after Ebed Melech pleaded for Jeremiah's life, the king decided to free him.

### Second Reading: Hebrews 12:1-4

This letter to the Hebrews inspires all Christians to persevere, in spite of the trials they may face. Jesus endured much suffering and was rewarded by God. Despite our struggles, we must remember Jesus' ability to endure and maintain strong faith in him.

### Gospel: Luke 12:49-53

Jesus tells his disciples that his message will not bring peace to the earth. Instead, even families will become sharply divided because some members will embrace him, while others condemn him.
