From the Desk of Father Ed:

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday is the last of the 5 Sundays from which we have heard passages from the Bread of Life discourse in John's Gospel. This Sunday's Gospel ends the 5th chapter in John's Bread of Life discourse. Throughout the 5th chapter Jesus repeatedly told his followers that he is the Bread that has come down from heaven. It was not the bread or the manna that Moses gave to the people in the desert that gave life but rather it is Jesus himself who gives us true life and promises us eternal life if we eat his Flesh and drink his Blood. We remain in him and He in us if we eat of his Body and Blood. We remain in him by believing in him and receiving him in the Holy Eucharist, the greatest gift that God has given to us.

The Jewish people of Jesus' time and many of his disciples had difficulty in accepting this teaching from our Lord. They thought he was referring to cannibalism when he told them they must eat his flesh and drink his blood and if they did not there would be no life in them. This teaching was too hard for them to follow and as a result most of his disciples left him. Jesus questioned his Apostles to see if they too would abandon him. *"Simon Peter answered him, 'Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God.'"*

In our Gospel this weekend we hear that, *"many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him."* We also witness in our time many of Jesus' disciples have decided to leave him. They leave him by no longer practicing their Catholic faith. Many Catholics no longer see the importance of attending Mass on Sunday and the Holy Days of Obligation even though our Church teaches that if you deliberately miss Mass on Sunday or a Holy Day of Obligation then you have committed a grave sin and need to go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation and confess your sin before receiving the Eucharist. There are exceptions and allowances if you are sick or if you need to care for a child or sick person.

We abandon the Lord when we are not in communion with the Church's teaching; the Church that Jesus has established and overshadows by the Holy Spirit.

To be a disciple of Jesus requires that we stand with him and his Church. We are not afraid to give witness to the truth especially the moral truths of our faith; especially to give witness that all life is sacred from the moment of conception to natural death. And the Church's teaching about marriage that it is exclusively for a man and a woman.

In our Gospel this weekend, the Lord asks each one of us, "Do you also want to leave?" Will we remain faithful to the Lord and his Church, The Roman Catholic Church or will we abandon him by following our own desires and the things of the world?

It takes strength and courage to remain with the Lord and his Church. If we stay close to him in our prayer life, and the Sacrament of Reconciliation to keep our souls right before the Lord, and then dine at the banquet of the Eucharist, He will remain in us and we will remain in him and he will be our strength. Jesus is the Holy One of God who loves us and has given his life for us so that we can live with him here and now and forever in the Kingdom of Heaven.

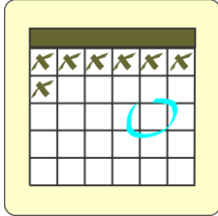

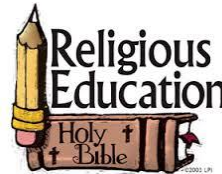
