From the Desk of Father Ed:

Dear Parishioners,

In our Gospel today two of Jesus' Apostles, James and John the sons of Zebedee ask him a favor. They want to know if they can have the seats of honor at Jesus' left and right when he comes into his kingdom. And almost immediately the other Apostles became indignant at James and John, not because of what they asked but because they asked first and feared losing out at this place of distinction, that is, to be seated next to the King of Kings and to share in his power and fame.

Jesus summoned them (the twelve) and said to them, "You know that those who are recognized as rulers over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones make their authority over them felt. But it shall not be so among you. Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all."

To be great in the eyes of God is to be a servant. To be a Christian is to follow Christ, "For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many." Our culture defines greatness in a much different way than what Jesus asked of his Apostles and disciples; He calls us to be slaves to one another and serve the needs of our brothers and sisters.

Jesus asked James and John, "Can you drink the cup that I drink or be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" Jesus assured them that they would drink of this cup, which represented the wrath of God poured out upon sinful humanity. Jesus drank this cup of suffering at his passion and handed over his life on the Cross as a ransom for many. His Apostles in their martyrdom shared in drinking this cup. They too were baptized in the blood of the Cross.

As Christians we too share in the Cross of Jesus; salvation is by way of the Cross, but we never walk it alone; our Lord is always with us. We are called to follow Jesus by taking up our Cross each day in a life of selfless love lived out through serving one another.

This weekend is pledge weekend as we continue with our Bishop's Annual Appeal, "Serving Christ Among Us". The Bishop's Annual Appeal gives us the perfect opportunity to serve our brothers and sisters in need by providing financial assistance to the many projects of our diocese. I thank you in advance for your generosity in the Bishop's campaign and the many people that your support will help, especially the formation of our future priests, our retired priests, the DPD (Department for People with Disabilities), Catholic Charities, which feeds the hungry, shelters the homeless and clothes the needy, and gives the much needed help to those who suffer from addiction. Please remember that for every dollar over our goal our parish will receive 50% in return.

James and John, the sons of Zebedee asked to be seated at the right and left of Jesus in his kingdom. Jesus invites us to a life of greatness by serving one another until the day he calls us home to be with him forever.

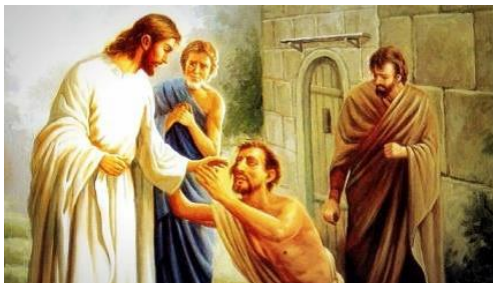
