Appalachia Outreach 2016 ***Thank You Saint Vincent Martyr***

Thank you to all the volunteers, their families and all the benefactors for ***“Helping Us, Help Others, Help Themselves.”*** Here is a brief summary of what was accomplished by the adults and teens from St. Vincent’s and St. Patrick’s in Appalachia this summer

- 9 families received new roofs in replacement of old leaky ones
- 1 family received a much needed wheel chair ramp
- 1 family received a bedroom/bathroom addition to an overcrowded trailer
- 2 families received new windows
- 1 family received new underpinning to their trailer
- 1 family received a new gravel driveway and walkway
- 1 family received all new flooring to replace damaged flooring from a flood

In addition, electrical & plumbing work was done, new porches were built, old porches were fixed, junk was hauled away to the dump because there is no bulk pick-up, and siding, fascia and soffits were installed. Overall, it was another successful summer. Thank you again to all who donated and to all who offered prayer. We hope that we can count on your support again next year!

Going again to Appalachia this year was just as rewarding to me as it has been in the past. I had met the people down in Preston County West Virginia before and knew what was expected of me as a church volunteer from St. Vincent Martyr. The summer of 2011 was my first time there with my oldest daughter and in 2013 I went back with my second daughter. Besides learning how to build a deck and to rebuild a porch, I met a lot of new people who I worked alongside of and the local people who we did the work for. Seeing a part of the country where material items aren't as plentiful as they are here in Madison is always an eye opener for me. The land is beautiful and the people make do with what they have and that's just the way it is. For the youth of our parishes and the adult volunteers who go down to help buy materials and do much needed home repairs are a big blessing for the homeowners of Preston County. This year was my third trip to Appalachia with my third daughter and besides helping to build a home addition, I also spent time talking to Margaret, the homeowner and her granddaughter, Emily, and learning about them and their family. The week that I was in Appalachia the Gospel passage about Martha and Mary was read to us. Martha spent her time preparing food and serving her guests and this is important to help the needs of others. Mary spent her time listening to Jesus, giving him her undivided attention. It is just as important or probably even more important to be a lot like Mary. On Monday morning I think all the volunteers start out like Martha, but then as the week moves on, the Mary in us intensifies. I'd like to think that this year I became a little more like Mary.

SUNDAY READINGS

TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 66:18-21

Isaiah portrays a time when people from many nations will gather in Jerusalem and proclaim God's glory. God's messengers will teach many nations about God. Just as the Israelites bring offerings, these messengers will bring people from all nations to worship.

Second Reading: Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

The Hebrews are told that God disciplines those he loves. When a parent disciplines a child, the child usually learns what is expected of him. The Hebrews are encouraged to face life's trials as a form of discipline, and attempt to learn something from them.

Gospel: Luke 13:22-30

Jesus warns that the door to God's kingdom will be locked for those who ignored his wishes. Many people will come from all nations and take their place in God's kingdom. Others will not be recognized by God, and he will reject them.
