The Pastor's Corner

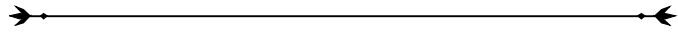
In choosing the new stained glass windows for the north gathering space we wanted to portray a Christian's call to both prayer and action. The saint we selected as a model of prayer is Saint Teresa of Avila. Also known as Teresa of Jesus, this holy woman was the founder of the Order of Discalced (shoeless) Carmelites. So why no shoes? Very simply the religious in this community wore sandals rather than shoes. So who was this great saint of the church?

Teresa was born in Spain in the year 1515. Her grandfather was a member of the Jewish faith who was forced to convert to Catholicism to avoid exile or death. This had a traumatic effect on her father who was quite stern and wanted Teresa and her siblings to devote themselves solely to serious studies. Her mother, on the other hand, introduced her to romance novels which fired up Teresa's mind and heart with a sense of adventure. Teresa and her brother were also enamored of the tales of the early Christian martyrs and actually ran away once to North Africa hoping to give their lives for the faith. When an uncle brought them back they changed their game to pretending they were hermits outside the city wall - talk about playing church as a child? I was happy with making believe I was saying Mass!

A lively and charismatic young girl. Teresa enjoyed a happy childhood until she was 14, when her mother died. At that point her father began to monitor her social life much more closely, leading her to sneaking out at night and lying to her dad about where she was - where have I heard that before?! When it became obvious to him that his daughter cared too much for new clothes, secret romances, and flirting, he sent her away to live in a convent as a boarder. To her surprise she found she liked convent life as it was less strict than life at home. After an illness made her return home she decided to be a nun. When her father refused to consent to her joining a religious order she ran away to the local Carmelite convent where she found that the Carmelite rule had been totally abandoned. A second illness brought her home again during which she was introduced to quiet interior prayer.

Through the intercession of St. Joseph she was cured of her sickness and returned to the convent and immersed herself in the social life there, almost giving up on her spiritual practice of quiet meditation. She claimed that it was impossible for her to sit still for an hour. Challenged by a confessor to try again, and inspired by the example of Mary Magdalene and St. Augustine she found her way once again to a life of prayer. Her prayer was accompanied by visions which made her subject to much ridicule by her former friends. When she complained about this to Jesus he told her that's how he treats all his friends, to which she replied: "no wonder you don't have many of them!"

In 1557 Teresa experienced her most famous vision of an angel thrusting a flaming arrow into her heart thus leaving this great saint inflamed with the desire to truly serve God with a pure life. She decided to try and return to the original Carmelite rule of humility, poverty and prayer. She began a reformed convent where connections to the outside world were kept at a minimum, silence was maintained throughout the day and the nuns wore habits of rough wool - and sandals, instead of shoes. Thus began the Discalced Order of Carmelites. And that was only the beginning - stay tuned for Part II next weekend.



This weekend we celebrate Memorial Day - a day of remembering those who made the ultimate sacrifice of giving their lives for their country. On this day we are reminded that freedom is not free - it is gained and preserved by the men and women who have served and continue to serve our great nation. Let us not forget them, but rather offer a resounding prayer of thanksgiving for their selfless commitment to these United States of America. They are God's blessing to America!

U.S. Flag Folding Ceremony:

The flag-folding ceremony represents the same religious principles on which our country was originally founded. The portion of the flag denoting honor is the canton of blue containing the stars representing the states our veterans served in uniform. The canton field of blue dresses from left to right and is inverted when draped as a pall on a casket of a veteran who has served our country in uniform.

The first fold of our flag is a symbol of life.

The second fold is a symbol of our belief in the eternal life.

The third fold is made in honor and remembrance of the veteran departing our ranks who gave a portion of life for the defense of our country to attain a peace throughout the world.

The fourth fold represents our weaker nature, for as American citizens trusting in God, it is to Him we turn in times of peace as well as in times of war for His divine guidance.

The fifth fold is a tribute to our country. Whether right or wrong, it is still our country.

The sixth fold is for where our hearts lie. It is with our heart that we pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

The seventh fold is a tribute to our Armed Forces, for it is through the Armed Forces that we protect our country and our flag against all her enemies, whether they be found within or without the boundaries of our republic.

The eighth fold is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day.

The ninth fold is a tribute to womanhood; for it has been through their faith, love, loyalty and devotion that the character of the men and women who have made this country great have been molded.

The tenth fold is a tribute to the father, for he, too, has given his sons and daughters for the defense of our country since they were first born.

The eleventh fold honors our Jewish citizens by representing the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon, and glorifies the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

The twelfth fold honors our Christian citizens, representing an emblem of eternity and glorifies God the Father, the Son, and Holy Spirit.

And finally the **thirteenth fold** when the flag is completely folded, and the stars are uppermost, reminding us of our nation's motto, "*In God We Trust.*"

After the flag is completely folded and tucked in, it takes on the appearance of a cocked hat, ever reminding us of the soldiers who served under General George Washington and the sailors and marines who served under Captain John Paul Jones who were followed by their comrades and shipmates in the Armed Forces of the United States, preserving for us the rights, privileges, and freedoms we enjoy today."

Next week is Pentecost

Wear Red!



Next Weekend we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost. Pentecost occurs 50 days after Easter. On Pentecost, which marks the end of the Easter Season, the Church celebrates the day on which the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles in the Upper Room. At Pentecost, the Apostles received the gifts of the Spirit and began the mission of Evangelizing throughout the world. The feast of Pentecost commemorates the Gift of the Holy Spirit in the life of the Church that is why Pentecost is often called “the birthday of the Church.” On this day Christ’s mission is completed and the New Covenant is inaugurated and the gifts of the Holy Spirit were poured out upon the Church. These gifts are wisdom, understanding, counsel, courage, knowledge, reverence and fear of the Lord.

The Liturgical color for Pentecost is red, symbolizing the tongues of fire of the Holy Spirit. We ask everyone attending Mass next weekend, to wear something red so that our parish church will be ablaze with the color of the Holy Spirit. There will be other changes in the worship space on Pentecost. The Easter decoration and color of gold will be replaced by red decoration for Pentecost Sunday and then by green for Ordinary time following Pentecost. After Pentecost, the Paschal Candle will be moved to its place by the Baptismal Font.

Stewardship

Here at Saint Vincent Martyr Parish we just finished First Eucharist Celebrations. I remember my First Communion Day, do you? It has been my privilege to serve in this stewardship position for several years. It is rewarding for me to teach children about Jesus, the importance of prayer and to let them feel the love of Jesus when they are kind and caring to each other. When they receive their First Reconciliation and FIRST Communion they feel how much Jesus loves them through the lessons they have learned. When they received First Communion, it will never be their FIRST again. The FIRST is very special. At Saint Vincent Martyr we make that FIRST very special. The children and their parents go to workshops, As a Catechist I put love into the lessons through prayer, song and scripture stories. The first time anyone meets Jesus in the bible they feel special. Our children are special.

A quick story to put a smile on your face. I told them the story about Jesus asking if anyone has never sinned be the first to throw the stone. The whole class threw the stone at me!!! We went over the bible story again. The second time they understood it.

Consider being a catechist, it is rewarding.
