





José de Arimatea: La Obra de Caridad

Continuamos nuestra reflexión del libro De la Cruz a la Tumba Vacía, de nuestro obispo Serratelli, traducido a nuestra lengua. Estas semanas estaremos leyendo el Capítulo 12.

“La membrecía de José en la corte suprema judía ciertamente,

explicaría por qué tenía fácil acceso a Pilato con su pedido de enterrar el cuerpo de Jesús y por qué Pilato concedió tan fácilmente su deseo. El procurador no era un hombre para recibir a cualquiera sin previo aviso. Sin embargo, José “*fue a Pilato y le pidió el cuerpo de Jesús*” (Mateo 27, 58).

Pilato no hubiera estado ansioso por entregar el cuerpo de Jesús a un conocido discípulo de Jesús. Temía que los discípulos llevaran a cabo una resurrección. Pero, no habría tenido problemas para entregar el cuerpo de Jesús a alguien que pertenecía a la misma corte que había condenado la muerte de Jesús. Sin miedo a que los judíos convirtieran a Jesús en un mártir.

José es un hombre bueno y justo que respeta la ley. Tanto Marcos como Lucas nos dicen que José estaba “*esperando el reino de Dios*” (Véase Marcos 15, 43, ver Lucas 23, 51). Los discípulos de Jesús no fueron los únicos que esperaban la llegada del Reino de Dios. Creían que Jesús mismo sería quien los libertaría de la tiranía de Roma y marcaría el comienzo del Reino de Dios en su día. Pero había muchos otros judíos devotos que no creían en Jesús. Sin embargo, todavía estaban esperando el Reino de Dios. Estos judíos observaban escrupulosamente a todos los soldados para prepararse para la venida del Reino de Dios. José seguramente pertenecía a este grupo”.

Continuaremos la próxima semana con este capítulo.
