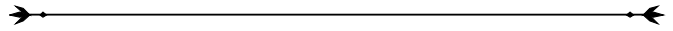

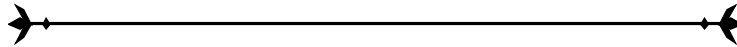

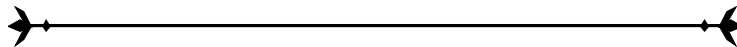
*Message from the Pastor*

This weekend we will be introducing two new things into our celebration of liturgy. The first is in reference to our celebration of Pentecost which will occur on the weekend of June 8 and 9. From now until then we want to pray as a community for the Holy Spirit to come into our midst and lead us to whatever future God has planned for us. The prayer we will be using is the ancient but simple Latin hymn - VENI SANCTE SPIRITUS. Led by our Music Ministry we will chant these words in their Taize setting for a brief time of about a minute after the homily and before the Creed. (At our 7:15 a.m. Mass we will recite the prayer silently in our hearts.) You may want to pray with hands open and eyes closed. The translation of these words is "Come Holy Spirit", inviting God's presence and action in our lives as disciples and as church. Let's see what happens - I trust it will be good!

The second thing we are introducing is a change in our communion procedure. We will now have four ministers of the Body of Christ in the center rather than two. We will continue to have an additional minister for the side sections. Kindly go to the minister most available to receive Holy Communion. Also, do not feel compelled to rush to get to the minister if he or she is waiting - take whatever time you need to approach the sacrament in a mindful and reverent way. Thanks for your patience and cooperation as we continue to find the best way to celebrate our liturgies.

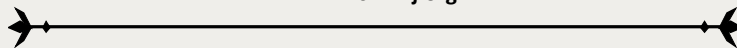

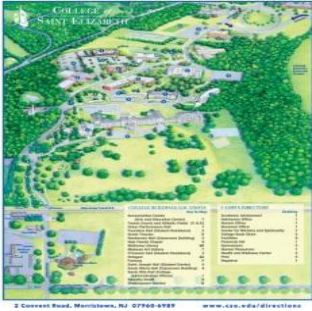

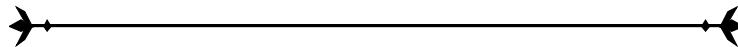

### PRAY WITH THE SCRIPTURES: EASTER SEASON BIBLE STUDY:: *The Resurrection Narratives*

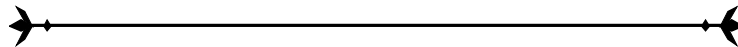
